STATE WATER COMMISSION MINUTES OF MEETING Held in Office of State Water Commission June 18, 1964

Members Present:

Henry Steinberger, Member from Donnybrook Einar Dahl, Member from Watford City Math Dahl, Commissioner, Department of Agriculture and Labor, Bismarck Richard P. Gallagher, Member from Mandan Milo W. Hoisveen, Secretary and Chief Engineer, State Engineer, Bismarck

The meeting of the State Water Commission was opened at 4:00 p.m. with Commissioner Steinberger presiding. Members present were Commissioners Einar Dahl, Math Dahl, Gallagher and Secretary Hoisveen.

MINUTES OF MAY 28, 1964 APPROVED Commissioner Math Dahl moved that the reading of the minutes be dispensed with and the minutes be approved as circulated. The

motion was seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl and carried.

DES LACS DAM Project #636 Des Lacs Dam was formerly maintained by the Great Northern Railway Company. This company has deeded the dam and property to the town

of Des Lacs. In 1963 following a series of cloudbursts this dam washed out. It is a dam which impounds water up to 28 feet in depth. The city relies on the dam for fire protection, some domestic water and farmers haul water from the dam for their own use. Secretary Hoisveen doubted that the Game and Fish Department would be able to participate in this project at this time. The Ward County Water Management District Board of Directors approached the State Water Commission with the idea of replacing the structure. The State Water Commission staff has designed a chute type spillway for the replacement. The work on the replacement could be commenced early in July. The total cost of such structure would be \$31,500, and would be shared on a 50-50 basis between the State Water Commission and the water management district. There is sufficient money in the multiple purpose fund to meet the Commission's share of the project.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl and carried that the State Water Commission participate in the Des Lacs Dam project with the Ward County Water Management District; should the State Game and Fish Department also participate in this project, the State Water Commission and the water management district would reduce their participation on the basis of 1/2 the amount contributed by the Game and Fish Department.

It was recommended by the Commission members that the contract agreement contain the provision that the area around the dam be open to the public and the Ward County Park Board be invited to aid in making the area into a recreation site.

EATON FLOOD IRRIGATION Project #227

The Eaton Flood Irrigation District has requested the State Water Commission to make a detailed survey of the entire Eaton Project.

The irrigation district has paid \$200 toward the survey. The district would like the Water Commission to come up with recommendations for a program that would take care of some of the deficiencies now existing on the project.

It was moved by Commissioner Einar Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl and carried that the State Water Commission participate in the survey of the Eaton Irrigation District.

HOMME DAM RECREATION AREA - Project #828

Some time ago the Commission authorized the expenditure of \$5000 toward the improvement and enhancement of recreation areas around

the state. The Commission has participated in several similar projects. There is still money available in the \$5000 fund for further improvements. The Commission has given technical advice to the Walsh County Park Board on recreation sites in the Homme Dam area. The Commission has also aided them in securing federal funds. Two areas have been developed and the park board is desirous of developing a third area. The total cost of such participation on the part of the park district and the Water Commission would be \$1400. Participation on the part of the Water Commission would be 40% or approximately \$560.

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl and carried that the State Water Commission participate with the Walsh County Park Board in the improvement and enhancement of a recreation area to the extent of 40% or \$560.

NORTH DAKOTA WATER USERS ASSOCIATION DUES

Secretary Hoisveen informed the Commission that the annual dues of the Commission to the North Dakota Water Users Association are payable in

the sum of \$1500. The Secretary informed the Commission of the assistance the Water Users Association has been to the Commission in the past.

It was moved by Commissioner Einar Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl and carried that the annual dues of \$1500 to the North Dakota Water Users Association be renewed.

AUDIT REPORT July 1, 1962 to June 30, 1963 The Audit Report of the State Water Commission from July 1, 1962 to June 30, 1963 as prepared by Curtis Olson, State Auditor, was presented to the Commission.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl and carried that the audit report be accepted and filed and that the staff of the State Water Commission be commended for its fine work.

ZONING IN CITIES
Development of Low
Lying Areas Subject
to Flooding

The development of low lying areas which are subject to flooding are becoming more common in most of our cities. Houses are being built in these areas and sold to unsuspecting residents. It has been suggested that possibly all cities

should include in their building code a requirement that the developers of the area install adequate flood control devices or advise their clients on the possibility of flooding, if that is a danger. It would appear that not too much attention is being paid to the drainage in the development areas. Commissioner Gallagher did not feel that the State Water Commission had any jurisdiction in this matter. It was suggested that Mr. Gallagher prepare a memorandum on this subject to be presented at the next Commission meeting.

VELVA FLOOD PROTECTIVE WORKS

Commissioner Steinberger inquired as to the present status of the flood protective works in the vicnity of Velva and what could be done

to speed up the Corps of Engineers. Secretary Hoisveen stated that this was a Corps of Engineers project and that it had advanced as far as the Chief's office and they are attempting to make the project an active one as soon as possible.

It was recommended that the Secretary be instructed to write the Corps of Engineers to see what further might be done to activate the project. The Secretary advised the Commissioners that several letters have been written to the Corps. Commissioner Gallagher suggested that the Mayor of Velva be put on the mailing list to receive copies of all correspondence relative to the Velva flood protection project.

DRAYTON DAM CONSTRUCTION BID

Bids were opened on June 15, 1964 concerning the construction of the Drayton Dam. The lowest bid was from Industrial Builders, Fargo,

who bid \$112,357.93. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Commission was obligated to pay \$100,000 toward the construction of Drayton Dam. Eventually the cost of the project when right of way and other items are added would approximate \$150 - \$160,000. Anything over the \$100,000 will be paid by the local legal entity.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, seconded Commissioner Gallagher and carried that the bid of the Industrial Builders, Fargo be accepted for \$112,357.93.

Commissioner Gallagher recommended that it would be well, before the constract is signed, to have a contract signed by the City of Drayton to participate to the extent previously agreed upon.

NATIONAL RECLAMATION ASSOCIATION BANQUET

Secretary Hoisveen announced that the National Reclamation Association Board of Directors Banquet was to be held that evening and

invited the Commission members to attend.

There being no further business the meeting

adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
