It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the following resolution be adopted and become a part of the minutes of this meeting.

<u>INMEMORIAM</u> John J. Walsh

WHEREAS, John J. Walsh, a civil engineer, had been active in water resources development work in the United States and Canada for forty years before becoming associated with the North Dakota State Water Commission at the time of its establishment by the State Legislature in 1937; and

WHEREAS, among the many duties and positions for which he was responsible he served as Acting Chief Engineer and Secretary of the Commission from June 4, 1943, to June 19, 1946, and as the Chief Engineer and Secretary thereof and the State Engineer from June 19, 1946 until his resignation June 30, 1954; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Walsh was an early registrant with the North Dakota Board of Engineers Registration, having been issued Professional Engineer Certificate of Registration No. 79; and

WHEREAS, he and his family left North Dakoga soon after he terminated his services with the Commission and established a home at Forest Grove, Oregon, where he passed away February 26, 1967, at the age of eighty-seven years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission, at a regular meeting held in its office in the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota, March 23, 1967, that it notes with sorrow the demise of its former Chief Engineer and Secretary and State Engineer, Mr. John J. Walsh, whose broad technical knowledge and wide practical experience, in the field of water and related land resources, enabled the State to engage in and undertake water programs and projects ranking high in need and importance to the welfare of all of the people of North Dakota, and it does hereby express sincere sympathy and condolences to his widow and family; and

#### NELSON -WALSH COUNTY GROUND-WATER STUDY

A combined ground-water study for Nelson and Walsh Counties has been scheduled for July 1, 1967. The total cost of the

survey would be \$210,000 to be shared on the following basis: State Water Commission, \$49,000; Nelson and Walsh Counties; \$46,000; North Dakota Geological Survey, \$13,000; and U. S. Geological Survey, \$102,000. Secretary Hoisveen recommended participation in the ground-water study.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the State Water Commission participate in the ground-water study for Nelson and Walsh Counties.

Commissioner Gray enters the meeting.

# SURFACE WATER QUALITY STUDIES

In accordance with the provisions of the Federal Water Quality Act of 1965, P. L. 89-234, water quality standards and

criteria for pollution control on all interstate waters within the State are to be adopted by the Health Department and the State Water Commission prior to July 1, 1967. Public hearings have been held relative to the standards for water quality and the standards modified in accordance with suggestions made at the hearing.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission approves the Surface Quality Water Standards.

#### WILLOW CREEK TOWNSHIP WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

Cliff Jochim stated that on the 15th of March, 1967, Mr. Nelson, Drainage Engineer, and he met with a group from

McHenry County to establish a Willow Creek Township Water Management District, which would border Bottineau and Pierce Counties. Willow Creek is a small creek but it has a large drainage area. It has caused widespread flooding each spring. Several meetings have been held with the County Commissioners of McHenry County relative to establishing a county-wide water management district. The County Commissioners have refused to approve the establishment of a county water management district. In the meantime, the landowners in Willow Creek Township are being flooded each spring. They want a legal entity so they can cooperate with Bottineau County. The township supervisors of Willow Creek Township have sent in a petition and resolution requesting the State Water Commission to establish a water management district covering the entire township. Several years ago the State Water Commission studied the matter and estimated that the snagging and clearing of Willow Creek would be \$40,000. The State Water Commission agreed to participate to the extent of 40 per cent of the cost. The State Water Commission will survey the area again and prepare an amended cost estimate.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that a hearing be held relative to the establishment of a water management district in Willow Creek Township, depending upon the recommendation of the State Engineers Report. RIVER BASIN PROJECT RESOLUTION

OAHE UNIT, JAMES DIVISION, MISSOURI Proposed legislation pending in Congress -H.R. 27 and 1163 and S. 6, would authorize the Secretary of the Interior "to con-

struct, operate and maintain...the first stage of the Oahe unit, James Division, Missouri River Basin project, South Dakota, for the principal purposes of furnishing a surface irrigation water supply for approximately 190,000 acres of land. furnishing water for municipal and industrial uses, controlling floods, enhancing the generation of power uses, conserving and developing fish and wildlife resources and enhancing outdoor recreation opportunities." A resolution favoring and supporting the proposed Oahe unit, has been prepared for the Commission's consideration.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the resolution favoring and supporting the proposed Oahe Unit, first stage, be adopted. (See Appendix A)

Commissioner Gallagher presides at the

meeting.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE 1967

Secretary Hoisveen reviewed the 1967 proposed construction program for the

State Water Commission. Bids have been let for Clausen Springs Dam and Harvey Dam and bids will be open on March 28 for McGregor Dam. The schedule is attached to the minutes of Appendix C.

BISBEE MUNICIPAL WATER SUPPLY AND RECREATION DAM

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Water Commission had authorized a survey on the Bisbee Dam a couple of years ago. The

survey and tentative designs have been completed. A preliminary cost estimate was prepared approximating \$85,000. The allocation of the cost formula was explained by the Secretary. Twenty-one and a haf per cent of the cost would be allocated to the municipal water supply and the remainder would be for recreation. There is an additional cost of \$22,500 for land purchases which would bring the total amount to \$107,000.

Mr. Duffy, attorney for the City of Bisbee, stated that the water situation for the City of Bisbee was very serious. The city depends upon wells for its municipal water supply. The useage has been sufficiently heavy so as to practically deplete this source of supply. The city can go about six miles south for a water supply but the cost for the six miles of pipe would be considerable. The cost for a distribution system would be \$190,000 without the land purchse. The various items included in the estimated cost of the dam were discussed as well as the allocation of the cost participation in the construction of the dam. Participation on the part of other agencies was also discussed. The Commission went into executive session. (Governor Guy presides.) After discussion as to the Commission's participation

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Steinberger and carried that the Commission assume 50 per cent of the balance over and above the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation's contribution, not to exceed \$35,000 and no State Water Commission money is to be used for the purchase of land but the \$35,000 will be devoted entirely to construction.

Commissioner Dahl leaves the meeting.

WATER ALLOCATION DEVELOPMENT OF 1,007,000 ACRE GARRISON DIVERSION UNIT (Water Right #1416 -Bureau of Reclamation)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Bureau of Reclamation made application for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Missouri, Souris, Sheyenne and James Rivers and their tributaries. The

amount of water requested is 3,145,000 acre-feet annually plus all return flows. It was the contention of the State Water Commission staff that the application should be made for water from the Missouri River only to permit development in the upper basins of the Sheyenne, Souris and James Rivers. A preliminary meeting was held with the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation officials on March 6, 1967. After this hearing the Bureau filed another application. The principal source of the proposed appropriation is the Missouri River. The secondary sources are the Souris, Sheyenne and James Rivers and their tributaries. The waters requested for appropriation from the secondary sources are the residual flows consisting of wastes, seepage and return flows resulting from the application of the water from the primary source in the operation of the Garrison Diversion Unit. The Secretary stated that after the permit has been granted to the Bureau of Reclamation the Commission will then make a declaration of intent to use certain waters of the Missouri River - to supplement the streams in western North Dakota.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission set aside 3,145,000 acre-feet of water from the Missouri River for irrigation, municipal, and industrial use, reservoir evaporation, power generation and pollution abatement in connection with the Garrison Diversion Unit, and request the State Engineer to prepare a Declaration of Intent to divert waters from the Missouri River for use in connection with future projects in southwestern North Dakota.

LOWER SHEYENNE RIVER DAM AND RESERVOIR NEAR KINDRED

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Senator Morgan had sent a letter to Secretary of the Interior Udall pleading that the

Sheyenne River below the City of Kindred be kept a "free flowing river." A resolution has been prepared for consideration of the Commission regarding this matter. A discussion was had concerning personalities in the resolution. It was the consensus of the Commissioners that personalities be eliminated from the resolution.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the resolution pertaining to the Sheyenne River Dam and Reservoir near Kindred be adopted. (Appendix B)

COLEHARBOR MUNICIPAL WATER SUPPLY DAM - CANCELLATION OF PARTIAL EXPENSE In 1959 the State Water Commission constructed a dam in cooperation with the Village of Coleharbor which was to act as a reservoir for municipal water. The

same year the City of Coleharbor installed a municipal water system which utilized an artifical filtration bed built into the embankment with a pump to deliver the water to the City. During the storm of June 24, 1966, a considerable quantity of silt was washed into the reservoir, causing the filtration bed to become impervious and the well to become inoperable. Because of this problem, the Water Commission staff conducted subsequent investigations and has located an aquifer underlying Coleharbor dam and reservoir and which is recharged by it. This aquifer will yield 100 gallons per minute. It is now necessary for the City to move their pump to utilize this source, thus subjecting the City of Coleharbor to additional expense above the extra costs of an unsuccessful reworking of the filtration bed and the ground-water study conducted by the Commission. The City is indebted to the Commission in the sum of \$2,321.65 for this survey. Since the additional expenses which were caused by an "act of God" have risen above the water systems ability to repay, the City is requesting the Commission to release it from paying any share of the ground-water study, of which its share is the above mentioned sum of \$2,321.65.

It was moved by Commissioner Steinberger, seconded by Commissioner Gallagher and carried that the debt of the City of Coleharbor to the State Water Commission in the amount of \$2,321.65 be cancelled.

Governor Guy leaves the meeting.

Commissioner Gallagher presides.

The Commission discussed the advisability of setting up rules and regulations which would be approved by the Attorney General and filed in each county. No action was taken on this matter.

STATE WATER PLAN

In order to proceed with the State Water Plan the Commission employed a consultant,

Harvey Banks of California. A two day conference was held in Bismarck with Mr. Banks. As a result of this conference the various categories for present and future demand of water were assigned to agencies interested in that particular category. There are a number of problems to be met, such as the economics of irrigation, shifting agricultural production, processing agricultural products, wetlands and pollution. Because of political implications, Mr. Banks suggested an out of state consultant be hired in regard to agricultural drainage and wetlands. Mr. Banks suggested M r. James P. Gilligan, Wildlands Research Center, University of California, Berkeley. Mr. Gilligan did much of the work in regard to wildlife waters which were used in the Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission Report. He seemed to have satisfied most groups with his recommendations in ORRRC. Approximately 40 per cent of the time of the members of the State Water Commission is spent in going over problems pertaining to the benefits and negations of drainage and wetland projects. Possibly the decisions arrived at by an uninterested outsider would be more acceptable to the various interests than decisions made at the State or local level.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the State Engineer be directed to negotiate for a consultant who will make a detailed study of drainage and wetland problems in North Dakota. BANK STABILIZATION - MISSOURI RIVER - LAKE MANDAN AND SQUARE BUTTE PROJECTS

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Senators Young and Burdick have introduced a Bill in Congress concerning operation and maintenance on the Missouri River Bank

Stabilization projects. The Corps of Engineers, Omaha District, is requesting acceptance of the completed facilities as they relate to Square Butte and Lake Mandan bank stabilization. Mr. Grindberg inspected the areas mentioned and recommended that certain areas be corrected. The Commissioners suggested that before taking action on this matter a field trip be planned for the next Commission meeting to acquaint the Commissioners with the situation. A tour of the works will be scheduled for the next meeting.

RUSH LAKE

Commissioner Dushinske stated that a hearing has been scheduled in Langdon on March 29, 1967 relative to draining 500 to 600 acres of land. The Commission was not advised of this meeting but the Secretary stated he had detailed C. P. Nelson to bepresent at the hearing and listen to proceedings.

The meeting recessed to reconvene at

1:45 p.m.

Members present for the afternoon session were Commissioners Gray, Gallagher, Hanson and Secretary Hoisveen voting for the Governor.

MONTY BURKE WATER RIGHT #1132

no longer needed but it did not pass.

The Commissioners discussed the water right application of Monty Burke. Secretary Hoisveen explained the

difficulties encountered. Messrs. Adams. Baeth and Burke are att empting to use the same aquifer. (Mr. Burke has also make application.) The existing situation is that if Baeth or Burke irrigate at the same time as Adams, there is no water for Adams. The rotation method was suggested for use in conjunction with acquifer pumpage. It was the consensus of the Commissioners what whatever policy is established should be fair to all participants.

It was suggested that a declaration of nonuse be prepared. The requests for release of easements would be handled on an individual basis.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commissioners adopt a declaration of intent concerning the land of Rolf Lindell. (See Appendix D.)

MANDAN LEVEE DAMAGE Governor Guy received a letter from the Office of Emergency Planning conerning the damage to facilities of the Lower Heart River Water Management District. The Corps of Engineers has surveyed the area and has prepared a report. It is suggested that the repair be made under P. L. 99. The repair work should be advertised so work can commence during this construction season as a similar recurrence could cause much damage to the levee system.

CASS COUNTY DRAIN #13 The State Water Commission has been asked to participate in the improvement of Cass County Drain #13. The estimate on the qualified construction costs is \$47,534.80. The Commission's 40 per cent participation would amount to \$19,013.92.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission participate in the construction of Cass County Drain #13 in an amount not to exceed \$19,013.92.

CASS COUNTY DRAIN #16 The Cass County Drain Board has requested Commission participation in Cass County Drain #16. The items qualified for participation total \$10,795.20 of which \$4,308.08 would be the Commission's share.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission participate in the construction of Cass County Drain #16 in an amount not to exceed \$4,308.08.

POLLUTION - HEART RIVER EAST OF DICKINSON The Northwest Coal Company has been dumping its spoil into the Heart River four miles east of Dickinson, thereby

causing a pollution problem. The situation has been inspected by staff members from the Game & Fish Department, Health Department and State Water Commission. As a result of these visits the company has agreed to stop operations until Monday to see how this problem can be solved. A detailed letter will be forwarded to this company stipulating requirements to be followed in halting such pollution.

PEMBINA COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT REQUEST FOR PARTICIPATION The Pembina County Water Management District has requested additional Commission participation in a channel change on the Pembina River. The

approximate cost of such channel improvement is \$1,400, of which the Commission's share would be \$560.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that the Commission participate in the additional channel improvement on the Pembina River not to exceed \$560.

#### RESOLUTION 67-3-235

Adopted by the

#### NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION

#### First Stage, Oahe Unit, James Division Missouri River Basin Project

WHEREAS, construction by the Federal Government of the four dams on Missouri River in South Dakota--Gavins Point, Fort Randall, Big Bend, and Oahe--has resulted in the loss to the State of over half a million acres of valuable agricultural land required for the projects, which loss can be partially mitigated through the irrigation development authorized by the Congress as a part of the Missouri River Basin Project in the Flood Control Act of 1944; and

WHEREAS, proposed legislation pending in Congress--H.R. 27 and 1163, and S. 6--would authorize the Secretary of the Interior "to construct operate, and maintain...the first stage of the Oahe unit, James division, Missouri River Basin project, South Dakota, for the principal purposes of furnishing a surface irrigation water supply for approximately 190,000 acres of land, furnishing water for municipal and industrial uses, controlling floods, enhancing the generation of power, conserving and developing fish and wildlife resources, and enhancing outdoor recreation opportunities, and other purposes"; and

WHEREAS, the unit report and legislative measures have been developed through exhaustive studies and investigations by the Bureau of Reclamation, South Dakota's congressional delegation, and affected local interests, and all have determined the unit to be engineeringly sound and economically feasible, and a development that will bring many benefits to South Dakota, the region, and the Nation through the balanced and stabilized economy in the area and other benefits which it will provide; and

WHEREAS, North Dakota as the upstream border state has a common interest with its sister state in the regional economy of the two-state area;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission, meeting in regular session in its office in the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota, March 23, 1967, that it strongly favors and supports the proposed Oahe unit, initial stage, development and does hereby most respectfully urge the Congress to consider and take favorable action upon the aforesaid legislative bills at the earliest practicable date; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary be and he is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Honorable Nils A. Boe, Governor of South Dakota; U. S. Senators Karl E. Mundt, George McGovern, Milton R. Young, and Quentin N. Burdick, and U. S. Representatives E. Y. Berry, Ben Reifel, Mark Andrews, and Thomas S. Kleppe; Honorable Stewart L. Udall, Secretary, Honorable Kenneth Holum, Assistant Secretary for Water and Power, and Honorable Floyd E. Dominy, Commissioner, Bureau of Reclamation, Department of the Interior.

#### RESOLUTION 67-3-236

#### Adopted by the

#### North Dakota State Water Commission March 23, 1967

Lower Sheyenne River Dam and Reservoir near Kindred North Dakota (SWC #1344)

WHEREAS, an opponent of the proposed dam on lower Sheyenne River near Kindred, North Dakota, under study by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Paul District, and scheduled for submittal in the current Fiscal Year, is reported by the Fargo, North Dakota Forum's Bismarck Bureau to have written Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall "pleading that the Sheyenne below Kindred be kept 'a free flowing river, "" explaining that by the term 'free flowing river' is meant "one that has no man-made impediments such as dams in the course"; and

WHEREAS, the location of the proposed dam site is two and one-half miles above the City of Kindred and the project does not contemplate the construction of any impediments below the city, and the river therefore would continue as a free-flowing stream in its natural channel below Kindred after construction of the dam as it does now; and

WHEREAS, although admittedly, the Sheyenne River has "outstanding beauty" it is not the only beautiful river but one of several naturally beautiful streams in the State, and the construction of the proposed project with miles of multi-purpose reservoired water, for regulated release, would greatly enhance the aesthetic as well as the beneficial values of the sometimes flooding, sometimes dry stream; and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers has recently evaluated the benefits and costs of several alternative plans to provide additional flood protection at Valley City, Lisbon, Southwest Fargo, and other downstream areas, including local flood protection works for Lisbon, raising of Baldhill Dam, and additional reservoir upstream from Lake Ashtabula, these preliminary studies indicate that neither local protection works nor reservoir storage would be economically feasible as the average annual costs greatly exceed the average annual benefits and therefore neither alternative plan is warranted at this time; but it appears that because of the large capacity of the proposed Kindred reservoir it would provide limited additional flood protection for Valley City, Lisbon, and other areas by the transfer of a portion of the available water supply storage from Lake Ashtabula to the proposed Kindred Reservoir, thus permitting more storage in Lake Ashtabula to be used for flood control; and

WHEREAS, the State Water Commission--the legal state agency having control and jurisdiction over the State's water and related land resources-on September 30, 1965, adopted Resolution 65-9-223 relative to the proposed project by which it did then and does now -

"endorse, approve and support the aforesaid preliminary plans of the Corps of Engineers for said improvement, and any engineeringly feasible modifications thereof or improvement therein," and the Commission does now as it did then urge "the U. S. Army Engineering District, St. Paul, to prosecute the remaining investigative work and studies with all possible speed and vigor to the end that final plans may be developed and submitted to affected interests and entities concerned for processing through regular channels, leading to authorization and construction at the earliest possible time..."; and

WHEREAS, Senate Concurrent Resolution "R" was sponsored by the 1965 Legislative Assembly and Senate Concurrent Resolution "X" was sponsored in the 1967 Legislative Assembly with a view of seeking and obtaining

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legislative opposition to and disapproval of the proposed project near Kindred, and even though both Resolutions were referred to and heard before the committee chaired by the sponsor, the reports of the majority of the committee members for indefinite postponement were overwhelmingly adopted by the Senate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission, in a regular meeting in its office in the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota, March 23, 1967, that it reaffirms its previous position expressed in its Resolution adopted September 30, 1965, regarding the proposed Kindred Dam and Reservoir, and trusts that the Preliminary or Interim Report thereon will soon be available for public review; and
