MINUTES NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Held at Clarence Parker Hotel, Minot, North Dakota May 28, 1968

The Commission convened at 9:30 a.m. with all Commissioners present. Governor Guy presided.

MINUTES OF MAY 14, 1968 APPROVED

APPROVED It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the May 14, 1968 minutes be approved as circulated.

D. M. STEVENS - RESOLUTION D. M. Stevens, International Joint Commission member on the Canadian Section.

> It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission adopt Resolution 68-5-255 expressing sympathy to the family of D. M. Stevens.

OAHE IRRIGATION PROJECT (#827) Secretary Hoisveen advised the Commission that Congressman Kleppe had filed a statement with the House Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs along with the Commission's resolution favoring the approval of the Oahe Reclamation Project by the Interior and Insular Affairs Committee. The Secretary also mentioned that he had filed a statement with the Committee endorsing the project.

MISSOURI RIVER NAVIGATION PROJECT (#1456) trol - Rivers and Harbors, advising them of the inequities in providing Federal operation and maintenance on navigation projects for the Missouri River and not for bank stabilization works required in North Dakota. He implied that North Dakota was much concerned over the fact that its segment of the river had an unsatisfactory benefit-cost ratio in accordance with Corps of Engineers' report. He also mentioned the higher rail rates in North Dakota compared to areas where navigation is available and the inherent economic disadvantages.

The Commission requested the Secretary to acknowledge and express appreciation to Senator Burdick for his assistance.

WATER RIGHT PERMITS #1546 presented to the Commission by the Secretary for consideration. The application of Karl Vander Wal, Pollock, South Dakota, to divert 174 acre-feet of water from the Oahe Reservoir for the purpose of irrigating 87 acres of land was

The State Engineer, Milo W. Hoisveen, having considered the application and made his recommendation thereon for 174 acrefeet to irrigate 87 acres of land, it was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the application be approved and the conditional permit granted for the diversion of 174 acre-feet to irrigate 87 acres of land, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit.

#1550 The application of Texaco, Inc., Denver, to divert 940 acre-feet of water from underground sources for industrial use was presented to the Commission by the Secretary for consideration.

The State Engineer, Milo W. Hoisveen, having considered the application and made his recommendation thereon for 940 acrefeet for industrial use, it was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the application be approved and the conditional permit granted for the diversion of 940 acre-feet of water for industrial use, contingent upon the results of the hearing, and subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit.

NORTH DAKOTA WATER USERS ASSOCIATION DUES (A-37) the extensive services provided by this organization. Since the Commission will be paying \$700 to the National Reclamation Association for dues which were previously paid by the Water Users Association, it was felt that a reduction from the \$2,500 should be made.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Commission pay \$2,000 to the North Dakota Water Users Association for 1968 dues for services provided.

FARGO 12th AVENUE NORTH The City of Fargo is requesting cost DAM (#591) participation in the repair of the Fargo 12th Avenue North Dam on the Red River. Total estimated costs are \$21,300 for the structure utilized for bank stabilization and recreation. It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Commission participate in the construction of the Fargo 12th Avenue North Dam to the extent of 50 per cent for the estimated repair costs up to \$10,650. MINOT WATER SUPPLY It is estimated the City's surface water (#782) supply will only last about 10 to 11 days and its ground-water supply will last only 21 days. The best alternative, the City feels, is to try to obtain added water from Lake Darling for several years until the Velva Canal section of the Garrison Diversion Unit is constructed and water becomes available from that location. Minot's cost to obtain water from the Velva Canal would involve a $$6\frac{1}{4}$ million capital investment. Another alternative to obtaining additional water is a 42 mile pipeline to Lake Sakakawea involving an initial capital investment of \$12 million and substantial operation and maintenance costs. The Commission suggested that Minot institute an extensive water conservation program including suspension of lawn irrigation. The City averred that they have been practicing stringent conservation measures and felt that no headway was being made with the Bureau concerning use of Lake Darling waters despite these measures and conferences with Bureau officials. Other alternatives mentioned were obtaining water from Estevan Dam in Canada, obtaining releases of permits from agricultural users with prior rights and transferring the Foot Ranch water permit to the City. It was the general consensus that the Bureau would make releases for human consumption should an emergency exist. It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission cooperate with the City of Minot in providing the waters allocated to the Foot Ranch lands.

BAETH WATER PERMIT Secretary Hoisveen related the procedure, by (W.R.#957) judicial action, which Baeth, through his attorney, has suggested to be followed for relocating the Baeth well on the McKenzie aquifer.

Commissioner Gallagher suggested that rules and regulations be promulgated by the Commission for efficient management of all ground-water aquifers. Secretary Hoisveen indicated that all permits for ground water now indicate that the Commission may reduce the allowed pumpage

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if conditions so dictate. He related the conditions which preceded the issuance of the initial water permit in the McKenzie aquifer. He indicated the permit was issued during an extremely bad drouth period. A shortage of engineering help and the lack of a pumping test contributed to the problem. He stated that this has led to curtailing development in the aquifer.

It was moved by Commissioner Jungroth and seconded by Commissioner Steinberger that the Commission drill an exploratory observation well in the McKenzie aquifer if an advantageous cost-sharing arrangement can be effected with Mr. Baeth.

Upon voice vote all Commissioners voted aye except Commissioner Gallagher who voted nay. The motion was declared adopted.

NORTH DAKOTA RESOURCE CONSERVATION The Soil Conservation Service has received AND DEVELOPMENT PROJECT - SOIL approval for the first resource conserva-CONSERVATION SERVICE (#1490) tion and development project in North Dakota covering the counties of Grant, Sioux, Morton, Oliver and Mercer. The project's primary objective is to stimulate economic activity in the project area.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the Commission cooperate with the Soil Conservation Service in this endeavor to the fullest extent possible and express its compliments to the Soil Conservation Service for their efforts.

LIGNITE RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT (#1495)

Secretary Hoisveen suggested that the Commission survey, catalog and develop the

water resources in the lignite coal areas of North Dakota to act as a catalyst in attracting thermal electric generating plants and other industrial developments to North Dakota. It was implied that the operations of Garrison Reservoir were making plant locations on the river banks an impossibility, consequently, coal consuming plants would be required to locate elsewhere.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the Commission initially survey and catalog the water resources of southwestern North Dakota to provide the necessary resources for industrial development and survey other areas of North Dakota as industrial potentials assert themselves.

In addition Commissioner Gallagher suggested the North Dakota Water Users Association be requested to promote the establishment of the Southwestern North Dakota Development District which had been proposed abouth eight or nine years ago to the Legislature.

NORTH DAKOTA WETLANDS -STANFORD RESEARCH INSTITUTE REPORT (#1489)

Governor Guy read the May 8, 1968 letter from the Stanford Research Institute which included a bill for \$37,877.85 and advising the Commission that they had completed the study of North Dakota Wetlands.

It was pointed out that the original contract with the Institute for the study limited the expenditure to \$15,300 which was amended to provide an additional \$9,000 for the work as outlined in their proposal. The bill submitted is \$13,577.85 over the total contracted amount of \$24,300.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that a maximum of \$24,300 be paid to the Stanford Research Institute and they be advised to make available to the Commission an additional 990 copies of the report as provided in the agreement.

The Secretary was requested to inform the Stanford Research Institute of the Commission's apprehension in considering payment of any additional funds over the contract amount.

It was moved by Commissioner Jungroth, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, and carried that the Stanford Research Institute be allowed to distribute copies of the report if they so desire, provided it is done at no cost to the State Water Commission.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:25 a.m.
