MINUTES NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Held in Grafton, North Dakota May 21, 1969

The Commission enplaned at Bismarck at 9:00 a.m. and made an aerial inspection of Harvey Dam, Buffalo Lake, the Minnewaukan, Devils Lake and Churchs Ferry flood problem area, Big Coulee Dam, Mt. Carmel Dam site, Pembilier Dam site and the Pembina River flood damage area, and arrived in Grafton at 12:00 noon.

At Grafton a luncheon, hosted by the Grafton Chamber of Commerce, was held at which Mr. Myron Tiemens of the Corps of Engineers explained the Corps proposal for development of the South Branch of the Park River. Boards and officials at the luncheon, besides the members of the State Water Commission and Mr. Tiemens, were the City Council of Grafton, the Grafton Planning Commission, legislators from the area, the Walsh County Board of Commissioners, the Walsh County Water Management District Commissioners and the Grafton Chamber of Commerce. Following the luncheon, the business session of the Commission met at the Anderson Steakhouse.

MINUTES OF APRIL 9, 1969 **APPROVED**

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the reading of the minutes of the April 9th meeting be dispensed with and they be

approved as circulated. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all voted aye.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT APRIL 1969

Commissioner Jungroth moved the adoption of the financial statement for the month of April. Commissioner Hanson seconded.

All voted aye.

RELATING TO ASSESSMENT FOR THE SOURIS-RED-RAINY RIVER BASINS COMMISSION (#305)

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission pay the remaining assessment due to the Souris-Red-Rainy River Basins Commission, the amount being

approximately \$7,700. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye.

DUES

National Rivers and Harbors Congress: National Reclamation Association; North Dakota Water Users Association

seconded and all members voted aye.

WATER PERMITS #1586, #1594, #1607, #1612 #1627-#1632

be approved.

Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission pay dues as follows: The National Rivers and Harbors Congress, \$125; National Reclamation Association, \$666.67; North Dakota Water Users Association, \$2,000. Commissioner Dushinske

Secretary Hoisveen presented ten water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that these water permits

It was moved by Commissioner Jungroth that the conditional permits be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit. Commission Dahl seconded; all commissioners voted aye.

MINOT FLOOD CONTROL RESOLUTION (#1408)

on flood control works for the City of Minot. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all voted aye. (See Appendix B 69-5-268)

FLOOD FORECASTING FOR CITY OF MINOT -RESOLUTION

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the resolution requesting the Department of Commerce to extend flood forecasting to the Souris River be approved.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the

Water Commission adopt the resolution

Commissioner Hanson seconded, all members voted aye. (See Appendix C 69-5-266)

MISSOURI RIVER BANK STABILIZATION EASEMENTS (#576)

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the Secretary be given authority to execute such easements as are needed for installa-

tion of bank stabilization works in the Bismarck-Mandan area. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix D 69-5-267)

ELLENDALE GROUND-WATER STUDY (#750)

The City of Ellendale has requested that a ground-water study be implemented on an emergency basis for the solution to

the water shortage problems in that city.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the Commission participate in a study for ground water in the Ellendale area in the amount of 50 percent of the estimated cost, which is \$16,335. Commissioner Dushinske seconded, all members voted aye.

OPERATION FORESIGHT (#1516)

Dakota.

Secretary Hoisveen reported on the efforts of the Corps of Engineers in conducting Operation Foresight to minimize damages from the floods during 1969 in North

Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission pass a resolution commending Colonel Hesse and the staff of the St. Paul District for their efficient operation of the many floods in North Dakota. (See Appendix E 69-5-270)

Colonel Hesse

Secretary Hoisveen reported that Colonel Hesse, District Engineer, St. Paul

District, Corps of Engineers, has been transferred to Europe.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission approve a resolution commending Colonel Hesse for his accomplishments in the field of water management during his tour of duty as St.Paul Corps of Engineers District Engineer. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all voted aye. (See Appendix F 69-5-269)

HOOPLE MUNICIPAL WATER SUPPLY (#765)

The State Water Commission has received a request from Hoople, North Dakota, in Walsh County, to assist in locating a

supply of municipal water.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission participate in conducting a survey which will attempt to locate a municipal water supply for the City of Hoople. Commissioner Dahl seconded; all members voted aye.

FLOOD FORECASTING IN NORTH DAKOTA (#1516)

Secretary Hoisveen presented a proposal which has been made by the State University for new methods of predicting floods.

This method is a neutron tube which is inserted in a predrilled hole to determine moisture present at the location. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Basin Commission will be requested to pay the costs in the Souris-Red Basin but the State Water Commission would have to pay the installation costs in the western part of the State. He stated that another advantage of this is that the amount of soil moisture is checked and the farmers can be advised as to the proper use of fertilizer, irrigation etc. Secretary Hoisveen said that this method will be further discussed at the International Souris River Board of Control meeting in Winnipeg on May 28, 1969.

Commissioner Hanson moved that it be placed on the agenda for the next meeting when more information is available. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all commissioners voted aye.

FUND TRANSFER FOR TRACTOR

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the staff had mailed a letter to the Emergency

Commission requesting a fund transfer for the purchase of a new truck-tractor to pull the Commission's lowboy. This was made necessary by the fact that excessive use of the present tractor during flood fighting resulted in its breaking down. The present tractor is 12 years old.

Commissioner Hanson moved that a cost comparison be made between owning and renting lowboy service and if such study favored the purchase over rental the staff is authorized to purchase a tractor at an amount not to exceed \$13,500 subject to Emergency Commission approval. Commissioner Dahl seconded; all members voted aye.

The study was approved by the Accounts and Purchases Department and is attached as Appendix G.

DEVILS LAKE BASIN (#416)

Governor Guy reviewed the situation which exists in the Churchs Ferry area.

He stated that a large amount of land is presently flooded in the area of Lake Alice-Lake Irvine, north of Highway #2. These farmers feel that Highway #2 is blocking runoff and causing excessive flooding in their area. He stated that a petition had been presented to the State Water Commission requesting a determination of the amount of water which may be expected to flow at that point. Upon notification of this determination, Highway Commissioner had a duty to install adequate culverts to handle this flow freely and unimpeded. After the Highway Commissioner had been notified of the determination which had been made by the Assistant State Engineer, and before the proper size culverts could be installed, Benson County had moved in court and obtained an injunction preventing any increase in the opening in Highway #2. The Governor stated that efforts were being made to get this injunction lifted so that the installation of proper culverts could go forward as needed.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission determine that the flow which Mauvais Coulee may be expected to carry at the outlet of Lake Irvine is 1200 cfs. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all members voted aye.

ECONOMIC STUDY OF EFFECTS
OF NORTH DAKOTA ECONOMY

At the last meeting of the State Water Commission, Mr. Gordon Gray, Chairman of The Souris-Red-Rainy River Basins Com-

mission, had suggested that the State Water Commission sponsor a study which would attempt to determine the inter-relation of the economy of the various parts of the Souris-Red-Rainy Basin on other parts of their basin, and the relation of this basin to the Minneapolis-St.Paul area. It was suggested that this study may have many uses other than those already suggested. Since many agencies of State Government would be able to use this study, it was suggested that an application should be made through the State Planning Agency to conduct such a study. It was further suggested that the project should initially emphasize the Souris-Red-Rainy Basin.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission act to initiate a study of the Souris-Red Rainy Basins to determine the benefits that the Minneapolis-St.Paul area receives from these areas and to determine the benefits that North Dakota trade centers receive from the Minnesota portion of these basins and vice versa. Commissioner Hanson seconded; all members voted aye.

GROUND-WATER TEST IN MC KENZIE COUNTY (#860)

The State Highway Department has asked the Commission to participate in drilling a test hole which will determine the availability

of ground-water in western McKenzie County.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission cooperate with the Highway Department in conducting a test hole and that this cooperation consist of the expenditure of \$1,000 towards the drilling of the hole plus the necessary supervision and logging. Commission Dahl seconded; all members voted ave.

APPRECIATION

The Secretary was directed by the Commission to prepare a resolution of appreciation to the City of Grafton and the Grafton Chamber of Commerce for sponsor-

ing the luncheon which was held. (See appendix H 69-5-281)

INCREASED PEAKING CAPACITY ON MAINSTEM RESERVOIRS

Secretary Hoisveen informed the Commission that a news article had appeared just prior to the meeting of the Missouri

River Mainstem Reservoir Regulation Coordinating Committee which suggested that the Corps of Engineers was considering installing additional units in the mainstem reservoirs for peaking capacity. Since this would further aggravate the bank erosion condition which North Dakota is now experiencing, Secretary Hoisveen wrote a letter of opposition. He has received a reply which suggests that such a project might be one way to secure adequate bank stabilization works.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission adopt a position in support of Mr. Hoisveen's letter opposing an increase in the generating capacity of the power plants at Garrison Reservoir until such a time as adequate bank stabilization works have been installed. Commissioner Hanson seconded; all members voted aye.

NEXT COMMISSION MEETING

Commissioner Hanson reminded the State Water Commission that John Rouzie had extended an invitation to the Water Commission to meet in Bowman.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned and completed the aerial tour of projects by viewing Warsing Dam and Sykeston Dam and returning to Bismarck.

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Souris and Des Lacs Rivers Channel Improvement

WHEREAS, Minot, North Dakota has suffered severe loss as a result of flooding from the Des Lacs and Souris Rivers; and

WHEREAS, the large amount of water present in the watersheds of these rivers indicates that the potential for a recurrence is greatly enhanced; and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers has prepared a plan for a flood control dam and for channel improvement through and below the city of Minot, designated ¹⁴Plan B¹¹ which would substantially lessen the chances of major flood damage.

Army Corps of Engineers to do everything possible to authorize "Plan B" and install the channel improvement during the 1969 construction season.

Pertaining to Flood Forecasting for the Souris River Basin

WHEREAS, disastrous flooding has occurred in the Souris River Basin from snow melt water resulting in the evacuation of 12,000 people from the Souris River Valley; and

WHEREAS, besides the suffering brought upon the residents of the area, damages approximating \$30,000,000 will result to property owners in the valley; and

WHEREAS, it will require a number of years before adequate flood storage and channel improvements can be constructed to avert similar future disasters in the Souris River Valley.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission that the Department of Commerce request the United States Weather Bureau to provide flood forecasting services for the Souris River and its tributaries, thereby permitting the residents of this valley sufficient time to make preparations against impending floods. (The Commission has noted the excellent services rendered the people in the Red River Valley through flood forecasting and believes that such service could have reduced property losses materially.)
