MINUTES NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Held at the 2 Spot Cafe, Devils Lake June 27, 1969

Assistant Chief Engineer Grindberg presented a letter from Chief Engineer Milo W. Hoisveen regretting he could not attend the meeting due to illness and authorizing Mr. Grindberg to act in his behalf. (See Appendix C)

TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN

Commissioner Hanson moved that Commissioner Dushinske act as temporary chairman.

Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all voted aye.

MINUTES OF MAY 12, 1969 **APPROVED**

FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR MAY 1969 APPROVED

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the minutes of the last meeting be approved as circulated. Commissioner Hanson.

Assistant Chief Engineer Grindberg presented the financial statement for May 1969.

Commissioner Hanson moved the financial statement be approved. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all voted aye.

CORPS OF ENGINEERS' CERTIFICATES TO MILO W. HOISVEEN AND

ALAN GRINDBERG

Certificates have been received from the Corps of Engineers expressing appreciation for the assistance given by Chief Engineer Hoisveen and Assistant Chief Engineer Grindberg during the recent flood

Commissioner Hanson moved that the Commission commend Mr. Hoisveen and Mr. Grindberg for this recognition. Commisstioner Jungroth seconded; all voted aye.

LETTER OF APPRECIATION FROM BLACKTAIL DAM ASSN. (#560)

During spring runoff, the spillway at Blacktail Dam became clogged. As a result, the reservoir rose to such a level that many cottages were flooded

Water Commission crews worked around the clock to lower the water so this flooding could be alleviated.

Sheriff LeRoy Lutz, President of the Blacktail Dam Association, has written a letter of appreciation for the prompt action and stated that he had "never met a better group of representatives of any organization than our fieldmen."

The Commissioners noted receipt of the letter and thanked the staff. Commissioner Hanson suggested that some publicity should be given such recognition.

WATER RIGHTS #1633-#1641

Mr. Grindberg presented nine water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the Assistant

State Engineer that these water permits be approved.

It was moved by Commissioner Jungroth, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the nine conditional permits be approved subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit.

SPIRITWOOD LAKE (#461)

Commissioner Jungroth reviewed recent action on Spiritwood Lake for the Commission. He stated that the lake is

ringed with cottages. The lake is now above the meander line due to recent high water and has threatened to inundate some of these cottages. A county road building project lowered a culvert to allow more water to enter the lake, which would add to the problem.

The Commission staff has met with the cabin owners, water management board, county commissioners and farmers and has worked out a suggested solution. There will be a public hearing to establish a control elevation for the lake and the Commission will be asked to formally declare an established lake level.

JAMESTOWN DAM (#832)

Commissioner Jungroth reported that releases from Jamestown Dam were in excess of 350 cfs which is causing some

flooding in that city. He asked that the staff contact the Corps of Engineers to attempt to get the releases reduced.

KINDRED DAM (#1344)

Commissioner Jungroth called the attention of the Commission to the letter he had written concerning the proposed

Kindred Dam. In view of the short time that had elapsed since the letter was written and the number of Commissioners absent, it was decided to postpone discussion of this item until the next meeting.

SWEETWATER-DRY LAKE WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT EXPANSION (#722)

Commissioner Dushinske reviewed prior action on the creation of a county-wide water management district in Ramsey County. He stated that the State Water

Commission had been petitioned to dissolve the Chain Lakes Water Management District and alter the boundaries of the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District to include the entire county. Pursuant to such petition, the State Water Commission had conducted a hearing in Devils Lake on June 16, 1969.

At the hearing many questions were raised and a number of landowners became convinced that they objected to being included in the district. A group of these landowners requested permission to discuss the proposal with the Commission and present their petition for exclusion.

Those present were Laurence Kirk, Dick Maetzold, Leo Langton, Art Buck, Charles Stubbe and John Haugland and Clyde Duffy, attorneys. Commissioner Dushinske introduced Mr. Kirk who acted as spokesman for the group.

Mr. Kirk stated that a group of landowners in his area came to the hearing at Devils Lake to learn about a water management district. After the hearing they felt that their opinion had not been properly expressed. He stated that they are now outside the present districts and wish to stay out. He said that he realized three mills more in tax levy is not great but felt that the farmers are near the breaking point on taxes.

M r. Kirk stated that the time has been too short since the hearing to get properly organized but that he had petitions prepared and in the short time available has 222 signatures of property owners who object to being within the district. Mr. Kirk said he realized that a water management district can do other things than cooperate on watershed projects but that he felt the farmers in the outlying parts of the county would receive no benefits from the district. Mr. Kirk presented his petition to the acting secretary.

Mr. Jungroth asked Mr. Kirk how the number of petition signers compared with the total number of persons involved. Mr. Kirk said he had not had sufficient time to prepare such data but that in those townships where the petitions were circulated 90 to 95 per cent of the resident landowners signed.

M r. Kirk asked if a decision would be made at this meeting. Chairman Dushinske replied that it might be delayed. M r. Kirk requested a delay so they could more fully document their case. Mr. Kirk also asked what percentage of signatures were needed to keep an area out of the water management district. He was told that there was no fixed number or percentage required. Commissioner Dushinske suggested that it would be important to show the number of acres owned by each signer.

Mr. John Haugland stated that he represented many farmers who are in the present Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District who desire to be excluded. He presented petitions from

27 persons who requested the boundary be changed to exclude them. Their reason for requesting this is that their land does not drain into either Sweetwater or Dry Lake but south and east.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that action on the dissolution of Chain Lakes Water Management District and alteration of the boundaries of Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District be postponed in compliance with the request of the petitioners present. Commissioner Hanson seconded; all voted aye.

MINOT FLOOD CONTROL (#1408)

Acting Secretary Grindberg read a letter from Colonel Hesse, St. Paul District Engineer, concerning Minot flood control.

The letter stated that the Corps of Engineers felt that Plan 3 was the best alternative for flood control for the City of Minot and explained that it would be impossible to expect any construction this year.

MISSOURI RIVER BANK
STABILIZATION RESOLUTION Oliver County (#576)

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission reaffirm Resolution 69-6-272. Commissioner Hanson seconded; all voted aye.

MISSOURI RIVER BANK STABILIZATION BISMARCK -MANDAN AREA (#576-7A)

Assistant Chief Engineer Grindberg discussed the situation on the installation of bank stabilization works at Bismarck-Mandan. All easements on the

Bismarck side have been obtained. Only one easement on the Mandan side has been obtained and as a result the bid opening on the project has been delayed indefinitely.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission take the following action:

We, the North Dakota State Water Commission, request the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers to proceed at the earliest possible time to contract for bank stabilization along the east bank of the Missouri River in the Bismarck-Mandan area. Our request is based upon the following observations that we call to your attention:

- 1. The east side of the River is on the outside of a curve in the Missouri and is sustaining substantial erosion at this time.
- All required easements on this tract have been obtained.
- 3. The Corps of Engineers has established and surveyed the required curve and has drawn up plans and specifications for the necessary earth removal and rock emplacement.

- 4. A separate contract on the east side from the contract on the west side would eliminate trucks hauling rock across the bridges from a single rock-crushing area.
- 5. The erosion control work on the west bank could be accomplished later when easements' are obtained.
- 6. Since the erosion is more severe on the east bank, early protection there is critical.

Commissioner Hanson seconded the motion and upon voice vote all voted aye. Motion carried.
