MINUTES

NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION
Meeting Held in Bison Room, Clarence Parker Hotel
Minot, North Dakota
December 12, 1969

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. with Vice Chairman Gallagher presiding.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER
13, 1969 MEETING APPROVED

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the minutes of the November 13, 1969 meeting be approved as circulated. Commissioner

Hanson seconded; all members voted aye.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR MONTHS OF OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER, 1969 APPROVED Secretary Hoisveen presented the financial statements for the months of October and November, 1969 to the Commission members.

Commissioner Dushinske moved the approval of the financial statements for the months of October and November, 1969. Commissioner Hanson seconded; all members voted aye.

HAZEN FLOOD CONTROL (#1517)

Secretary Hoisveen introduced Mr. Leonard Wohlfeil, Mayor of the city of Hazen, North Dakota, who presented the proposed

flood control project for Hazen to the Commission. Mr. Wohlfeil stated that the Corps of Engineers has designed a project for flood control for the city of Hazen. The total cost of this project is in excess of \$400,000. The project would be constructed through Section 205 of the Flood Control Act. The local costs of this project are \$21,000. Mr. Wohlfeil stated that during the time that he had lived in Hazen, there have been four floods. He felt that the people of Hazen desired the flood control project and stated that it was a good project. Mr. Wohlfeil requested that the State Water Commission cooperate with the city of Hazen in implementing this flood control project by giving the necessary

assurances to the Corps of Engineers and assisting the city of Hazen with the local costs.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water
Commission assist Hazen in its flood control plan
by sharing 50 percent of the local costs in an
amount not to exceed \$10,500 and that the State
Water Commission adopt an Opinion Resolution
giving the necessary assurances to the Corps of
Engineers. Commissioner Dushinske seconded; all
members voted aye. (See Appendix "A")

PROBLEM IN WEST BAY AREA (#613 and #416) Mr. Tony Englehardt of Minnewaukan appeared before the Commission and presented and filed Petitions, Supporting Resolutions and letters

which request the State Water Commission to secure greater openings in Highway 57 and Highway 20 at the east side of Devils Lake to insure that the Devils Lake will not rise above its present elevation. Mr. Englehardt stated that all road crossings upstream of this point are larger and if Devils Lake rises, it will soon back through Ziebaugh's Pass, which will in turn, stop the flow through the West Bay area. He stated that many landowners have land under water in West Bay which they desire to see the water removed from. It is the feeling of the local people that if the State Highway Department will install adequate openings in these highways, the railroad in that area will be taken care of by the railway company.

Commissioner Hanson moved that the Chief Engineer be directed to negotiate with the State Highway Department to attempt to find a solution to this problem. Commissioner Jungroth seconded; all members voted aye.

LUCCA DRAIN AND LUCCA DAM (#1359 and #1377)

Secretary Hoisveen reported on a meeting held in the office of the State Water Commission to consider this project.

The meeting was attended by the Maple River and Barnes County Water Management Districts, who are proponents of this project, and Mr. Russell Stuart, State Game and Fish Department. It was reported that it now looks as if the local support for this project has dimmed. The dam and drain were inextricably tied together. In view of the lack of local support for these projects, the Water Management Board involved have suggested that no action be taken on the project until local pressures require reactivation.

REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR USE IN CONNECTION WITH CASS COUNTY DRAIN NO. 13 (#1069) Secretary Hoisveen stated that this drain had been approved for participation by the State Water Commission at an earlier meeting. Construction of the project resulted in an overrun of costs

in the amount of 15.2 percent or \$2,895.81.

Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission approve expenditure of an additional \$2,895.81 for Cass County Drain No. 13. Commissioner Dushinske seconded; all members voted aye.

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL
OF THE PROPOSED DUNN COUNTY
WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT
(#1521)

Secretary Hoisveen reported on hearings which had been held in Killdeer and Halliday to consider the formation of a water management district in Dunn County. It was reported that all persons

who attended the hearings were in favor of the establishment of such a district.

Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water
Commission approve the petition of the Board
of County Commissioners of Dunn County and
issue the Order Establishing the Dunn County
Water Management District. Commissioner
Dushinske seconded; all members voted aye. (See Appendix "B")

UPPER DES LACS LAKE (#554)

Secretary Hoisveen reviewed correspondence between the State Water Commission and the State Highway Department in regards

to the request made by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to create a dam which would raise the upper portion of the Des Lacs Lake. It appears from the most recent correspondence between the State Highway Department and the Fish and Wildlife Service that no action will be taken on this proposal at this time.

WATER PERMITS #1652, 1653 and 1666

Secretary Hoisveen presented three water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State

Engineer that these water permits be approved.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, and carried that the three conditional permits be approved. (See Appendix "C")

FUTURE COMMISSION MEETING It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Jungroth, and carried that the Commission hold its next meeting at Fargo, North Dakota sometime in January, 1970, to meet with the Chairman of the Souris-Red-Rainy River Basins Commission if it can be arranged.

There being no further business, the

meeting adjourned.

Appendix "A"

OPINION RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING AN OPINION ON THE WILLINGNESS AND ABILITY OF THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION TO COOPERATE IN A FLOOD PROTECTION PROJECT ON ANTELOPE CREEK

WHEREAS, the District Engineer, U. S. Army Engineer District, Omaha, Nebraska, has been directed under the authority of Section 205 of the 1948 Flood Control Act, as amended, to investigate and report on the advisability of undertaking measures for flood control on Antelope Creek at Hazen, North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the District Engineer, U. S. Army Engineer District, Omaha, Nebraska, has formulated a plan of improvement which has been explained and discussed with local interests; and

WHEREAS, the North Dakota State Water Commission, by virtue of Chapter 61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, as amended, has the power and authority to comply with the requirements of the Secretary of the Army preliminary to the construction of the project of local flood control at Hazen, North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the public necessity, public health, and the general welfare of the residents of Hazen, North Dakota, require the construction of the proposed plan of improvement for the protection of the said residents, and of the real and personal property within the area of the proposed flood protection project, in conformity with the plans and specifications for the construction of the said project as prepared by the Corps of Engineers of the U. S. Army; and

WHEREAS, the North Dakota State Water Commission desires to have the said project performed and done and desires to comply with all the requirements imposed by the said Act of Congress.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission that within the limitations imposed by the State of North Dakota, the said Commission will:

- a. Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements, and rights-of-way necessary for construction of the project;
- b. Hold and save the United States free from damages due to the construction works:
- Maintain and operate all the works after completion in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Army;
- d. Assume responsibility for all costs in excess of \$1,000,000;
- e. Perform without cost to the United States, in conjunction with furnishing rights-of-way, all necessary removal or alteration

of existing buildings and other improvements, and all necessary alterations to bridges (except railroads), roads, streets, sewers, and other utilities;

f. Prescribe and enforce regulations to prevent encroachments on the channel or rights-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that two true and correct copies of this Resolution be furnished the office of District Engineer, U. S. Army Engineer District, Omaha, Nebraska, as evidence of the desire of the said Commission to cooperate in securing the construction of the proposed flood protection project at Hazen, North Dakota.

ORDER

ESTABLISHING DUNN COUNTY WATER

MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Dunn County, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners, did on the 15th day of October, 1969, file with the State Water Commission its petition requesting the establishment of a water management district embodying within its boundaries all of the territory within the county; and

WHEREAS, the petition of Dunn County was accompanied by a certified copy of a resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of the County, adopted on the 19th day of October, 1969, authorizing and directing for and on behalf of Dunn County the filing of such petition; and

WHEREAS, the report of the Chief Engineer of the State Water Commission, and evidence submitted at two public hearings held in the cities of Killdeer and Halliday on the 17th day of November, 1969, after legal notice thereof, disclosed that adequate relief from flood waters through improvement of the various watershed areas in Dunn County, and investigation of water bearing aquifers, can best be accomplished by a water management district, vested with the authority to deal with water problems; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, at its regular meeting held in the city of Minot, North Dakota, on the 12th day of December, 1969, adopted a resolution approving the petition of Dunn County and directing its Chairman and Secretary to execute the Order of the Commission establishing a water management district to be designated and known as Dunn County Water Management District.

The Dunn County Water Management District, embracing within its boundaries the territory within the limits of Dunn County, is hereby established.
