## NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Held in Fred J. Fredrickson Memorial Library Bismarck, North Dakota

March 25, 1970

The meeting was called to order at 9:20 a.m. in the Fred J. Fredrickson Memorial Library with Vice-Chairman Richard Gallagher presiding.

MINUTES OF JANUARY 15, 1970 MEETING APPROVED

Commissioner Dahl moved and Commissioner Dushinske seconded that the minutes of the January 15, 1970 meeting be approved

as circulated. All mebers voted aye.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR JANUARY AND FEBRUARY, 1970 APPROVED

Matt Emerson, Assistant Secretary for the State Water Commission presented the financial statements for January and February, 1970. There was a brief dis-

February, 1970. There was a brief discussion regarding the statements following Mr. Emerson's remarks on the various accounts.

Commissioner Dushinske moved the approval of the financial statements for January and February, 1970. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

APPLICATION BY NORTHWESTERN BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY TO CROSS STREAMS WITH CABLE (#1373) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from John J. Postovit, District Plant Engineer for the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, regarding their proposal for a buried telephone system from Dickinson

through Manning to Killdeer to meet points east and west to link up with a further buried system proposed by the Consolidated Telephone Cooperative of Dickinson. This system will require them to cross the following rivers and creeks in order to complete the work: Green River, Russian Creek, Crooked Creek, Knife River, Spring Creek, Spring Creek west of Killdeer and Spring Creek east of Killdeer. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Commission staff have reviewed their proposed plans and recommends that the Commission grant them the permission to proceed with their proposal.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company be granted permission to proceed with the above proposal. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye.

CITY OF ELGIN REQUEST FOR GROUND-WATER STUDY (#951) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter and a Resolution from the city of Elgin, North Dakota, requesting the State Water Commission to conduct a ground-water

study for the city of Elgin. The estimated total cost of the study would be \$6,000; with the State Water Commission's participation in the study not to exceed \$3,000 and the city of Elgin's cost \$3,000.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the city of Elgin be granted a ground-water study and that the State Water Commission participate in the costs in an amount not to exceed \$3,000. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

A brief discussion was held regarding counties that possibly may request ground-water studies in the near future and studies in counties that are currently underway or are completed.

MISSOURI RIVER BANK STABILIZATION (#576) Secretary Hoisveen reviewed the status that led to the adoption of Resolution No. 70-3-281. The Commissioners were contacted by telephone on March 3, 1970,

heard the reading of the Resolution and then approved it for immediate submission to Washington, D. C. Secretary Hoisveen stated that he had met with Senator Young while in Washington, D. C. and the Senator was presenting a bill in the Senate for \$6 million for Missouri River bank stabilization works. Representative Thomas Kleppe also stated that he was presenting a companion bill in the House for support of the Resolution in obtaining the \$6 million requested for the works.

The Commissioners then looked at several maps showing the location of the bank stabilization work that had been done and the work that is needed to be done.

Vice-Chairman Gallagher stated that there is much damage along the Missouri River by Ricker Marina and the Missouri Valley Meat Company. A contract award has been made for work in this area.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Mr. Howard Christian, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Omaha, Nebraska, is expected to be in the State Water Commission office on April 1, 1970 and will visit with landowners in the Mandan area. The Commission reviewed different points along the river that are very much endangered; one in particular is the Steffenson area. Secretary Hoisveen stated that if the \$6 million is approved for bank stabilization works,

the Steffenson area will be included for protection.

Commissioner Dushinske asked if there is any chance for an overall protection project for the Missouri River. Secretary Hoisveen stated that it looked like the piecemeal route is going to have to be taken as suggested by Senator Young. It is going to cost between the estimated cost of \$50 to \$60 million to complete the entire project. The spotlight for the use of Federal funds appears to be on urban rather than rural areas.

Commissioner Dushinske moved the re-affirmation of the Missouri River Bank Stabilization Resolution No. 70-3-281. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "A")

THE MOUSE THAT ROARED AT MINOT - A FILM ON THE 1969 FLOOD

The Commissioners were shown a film entitled "The Mouse That Roared At Minot." This film showed the flood

tragedy that occurred in Minot, North Dakota in 1969.

POLICY ON SNAGGING AND CLEARING

Secretary Hoisveen stated that at the last Commission meeting, the Commission had requested a rough estimate of

snagging and clearing work which could be expected to be requested in the near future. Mr. Al Grindberg made this study and presented it to the Commissioners. He stated that the State Water Commission has given assurances on a total of 354 miles of river to date. Shortly, another 35 miles of river will be snagged and cleared. He also gave a list of other rivers which could be benefitted in the future if this process was completed. All work would be cost shared; with the State Water Commission's participation 50 percent. It would cost the State Water Commission approximately \$30,000 per year for cost sharing on a 50-50 basis on that work for which it is committed and another \$30,000 per year for other streams.

It was suggested by the Commission that action be deferred on the snagging and clearing procedure until the next Commission meeting at which time Governor Guy will be approached in asking for Legislative assistance.

STARKWEATHER WATERSHED (#842)

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter and an Agreement from Mr. Robert Burwell, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, regarding

the Starkweather Watershed project. This Agreement was reached between representatives of the Soil Conservation Service, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, the Sweetwater-Dry Lake Water Management District and the State Water Commission, on January 19, 1970. Secretary Hoisveen stated that Governor Guy had sent a letter commending Mr. Jim McBroom of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife for his efforts in solving the Starkweather impasse. A copy of the letter was also sent to Mr. John S. Gottschalk, Director, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, Washington, D. C. It was suggested that a commendatory letter also be sent to Mr. Burwell. CONSTRUCTION BOND **GUARANTEE FUND** 

Secretary Hoisveen reported that Cliff Jochim, Attorney General for the State Water Commission, had attended a meeting

of the Audit and Fiscal Review Committee regarding the status of the Construction Bond Guarantee Fund. He had stated that it should be made available to all state agencies that may need a Bond Guarantee Fund. After much discussion, the Committee agreed to recommend that the next session of the Legislature be asked to eliminate this fund. Commissioner Gallagher stated that perhaps the Construction Bond Guarantee Fund should be analyzed by Mr. Art Whitney of Minneapolis.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF RURAL SEWER DISTRICT IN SOUTHEAST CASS COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT (#720)

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Mr. Marshall W. Moore of Moore Engineering Company of West Fargo, North Dakota, regarding their proposal to install a sewage collection system south of the cith of West Fargo. At present, the

residences of the area are using individual septic tanks and drain fields for their domestic wastes. Eventually, there is a good chance of well contamination and pollution of the Sheyenne River. This system would use eight-inch pipelines discharging the raw sewage to the city of West Fargo collection sewage and the sewage will then be treated in the West Fargo waste stabilization pond. The Southeast Cass County Water Management District is making a request that the State Water Commission approve these plans and proposal for the system. Following the State Water Commission approval, the State Health Department will act on it. Secretary Hoisveen made a recommendation that the State Water Commission approve the above proposal.

> Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission approve the proposal for the Southeast Cass County Water Management District Sewer District. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

It was the request of the Commission that the Attorney General follow this very closely.

BUFORD-TRENTON AGGRADATION PROBLEM (#222)

Secretary Hoisveen pointed out the location of the Buford-Trenton project to the Commissioners and discussed briefly the status of the aggradation that appears

to be occurring in the Missouri River as it enters Lake Sakakawea. Approximately, 28,000 acres of land is involved in this problem. Mr. Arley Bjella, Lawyer from Williston, North Dakota, has asked Secretary Hoisveen to accompany him to Washington, D. C. to meet with the Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation people regarding this problem.

BEULAH FLOOD CONTROL **PROJECT** (#1517)

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Colonel B. P. Pendergrass, Corps of Engineers, Omaha, Nebraska, regarding the Beulah Flood Control project. The

estimated cost of the potential channel improvement would be approximately \$650,000 of which \$365,400 would be local costs. The city of Beulah feels that this cost is beyond its financial means and that they could not furnish the

necessary local cooperation. Due to this lack of required local cooperation, further studies of the Beulah Flood Control Project have been terminated.

GRAND FORKS COUNTY DRAIN NO. 37 (#1505)

Secretary Hoisveen reviewed the status of the Hegton Drain (Grand Forks County Drain No. 37). During the time when state aid should have been requested,

a change in attorneys occurred. This caused a misunderstanding and accounts why there was not a request filed for drainage funds until after the drain was completed. Mr. C. P. Nelson, Drainage Engineer for the State Water Commission, has reviewed the plans and the completed drain very carefully and it is his recommendation that the State Water Commission participate in the Grand Forks County Drain No. 37 in the amount of \$1,218.14.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission participate in the Grand Forks County Drain No. 37 in the amount of \$1,218.14. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted ave.

CASS COUNTY DRAIN NO. 3C (#1065)

Secretary Hoisveen reported that Cass County Drain No. 3C has received \$13,053.20 from the State Water Commission as state participation. Actual construc-

tion costs exceeded the original estimate by \$17,389.26, which made a final cost of \$50,022.26. This would increase the state share in this drain to \$20,008.90. Mr. C. P. Nelson, Drainage Engineer, has reviewed this project and recommends that the State Water Commission participate in the extension of Cass County Drain No. 3C in the amount of \$6,955.70.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission participate in the extension of Cass County Drain No. 3C in the amount of \$6,955.70. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye.

STATUS OF DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR WATER FEE CHARGE FROM FEDERALLY-OWNED RESERVOIRS (#1494) Secretary Hoisveen reported that he had met with Mr. Gil Stamm, Department of the Interior, regarding the water fee charge from Federally-owned reservoirs. The proposal is an attempt to charge for water that is pumped by irrigators from Corps

of Engineers reservoirs in the Garrison and Oahe reservoirs. It also involves many other reservoirs in the United States.

DISPUTE WITH CANADA RELATIVE TO PEMBINA RIVER OVERFLOW (#567) Secretary Hoisveen reported briefly on the status of the dispute with Canada relative to the Pembina River overflow. He stated that this problem has been turned over to the U. S. Department of

State for solution by them or the International Joint Commission.

DEVILS LAKE OUTLET (#416)

Secretary Hoisveen reported that this is a result of petitions of the West Bay area near Minnewaukan. He stated that

the State Highway Department is working on the problem at present. It was stated that the best elevation to maintain Devils Lake is 1416. The question at present is what outlet do they need through North Dakota Highway #57 from the main lake to the East Bay to keep the level from rising. Possibly it could be solved by developing a series of culverts. There are only two 36-inch culverts there now. There would be approximately a four-foot rise in Devils Lake if the spring runoff is the same as last years'.

Commissioner Dushinske suggested that the State Water Commission help support a solution to the problem.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission request the Garrison Conservancy District, through resolution, the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation and the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife to expedite the early acquisition of the West Bay area. Copies of the resolution should also be sent to the North Dakota State Highway Department and to Mr. Tony Engelhardt, Minnewaukan. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "B"

REQUESTS FOR ADAMS-BOWMAN COUNTIES GROUND-WATER STUDY (#940)

Secretary Hoisveen reported that Adams and Bowman Counties have requested the State Water Commission to conduct a joint ground-water study in the two counties.

He stated the Commission currently has several studies underway and have completed a number of them. The Adams-Bowman Counties ground-water study would be conducted on the same basis as previously; 25 percent state, 25percent local and the remainder remitted by the U. S. Geological Survey. Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the State Water Commission conduct the Adams-Bowman Counties ground-water study.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission conduct the Adams-Bowman Counties ground-water study on the 25 percent state, 25 percent local and the remainder remitted by the U. S. Geological Survey basis. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye.

RESOLUTION IN MEMORIAM I. A. ACKER

Secretary Hoisveen read a proposed resolution in memoriam of Mr. I. A. Acker.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the presented proposed resolution be passed and that Mrs. I. A. Acker receive it. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "C")

RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION -OSCAR BERG Secretary Hoisveen read a proposed resolution of appreciation to Mr. Oscar Berg. Mr. Berg resigned his position as Executive Vice-President of the North

Dakota Water Users Association.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the presented proposed resolution be passed and forwarded to Mr. Oscar Berg thanking him for his fine efforts during his tenure as Executive Vice-President of the North Dakota Water Users Association. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "D")

RESOLUTION - RESIGNATION HENRY STEINBERGER

Secretary Hoisveen stated that Mr. Henry Steinberger had submitted his resignation. He will act in an advisory capacity to

the State Water Commission.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission prepare and present a resolution to Mr. Henry Steinberger thanking him for his many efforts while serving as State Water Commissioner and that Mr. Steinberger remain on the Board to act in an advisory capacity. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "E")

REQUEST FOR STUDY OF MIRROR LAKE (#420) Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from the Adams County Water Management District asking the State Water Commission for assistance in engineering and technical help in the

development of Mirror Lake. He recommends that the State Water Commission participate in this project, contingent upon receipt of \$200.

Commissioner Dushinske moved that the State Water Commission assist in engineering and technical help in the development of Mirror Lake contingent upon receipt of \$200. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

EXPENSES OF SOURIS-RED-RAINY RIVER BASINS COMMISSION ADVISORY COMMITTEE (#305) Commissioner Dushinske stated that Gordon Berg, Chairman of the Souris-Red-Rainy River Basins Commission Advisory Committee, has requested that the State Water Commission finance the expenses of the members of North Dakota's Souris-Red-Rainy River

Basins Commission Advisory Committee. He stated that the State of Minnesota pays the expenses of their members of this Committee. After considerable discussion regarding approximate number of meetings and approximate number of members attending the meeting, it was the consensus of the Commission to defer any action until the next Commission meeting and until after Mr. Grindberg has a chance to do further study on this and be cleared with the Audit and Fiscal Review Committee.

REQUEST FROM WELLS COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT FOR A STUDY OF DAM SITES IN WELLS COUNTY (#1314) Secretary Hoisveen stated that the Wells County Water Management District had made a request to the State Water Commission for investigation of the water resources of the county. The principal concern was the re-routing of the McClusky Canal,

which no longer utilizes the James River in the Fessenden area, for transfer of waters. This would enhance the recreation facilities on the James River. Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the State Water Commission approve the request contingent upon receipt of \$200.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the State Water Commission approve Wells County's request for assistanc to investigate and survey water resources development in Wells County, contingent upon receipt of \$200. Commissioner Dushinske seconded and all members voted aye.

WATER PERMITS #1650, 1654, 1668, 1672, 1676, 1679, 1680 and 1684 Secretary Hoisveen presented eight water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that these water permits be approved.

The status of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers water permit, No. 1679, was briefly discussed. After lengthy meetings with the Corps of Engineers in Washington, D. C., the following language was agreed upon to protect the life of the aquifer.

"This permit is granted with the understanding that if diversions under existing permits to withdraw water from the Fordville Aquifer are or will be adversely affected as a result of the exercise of rights created under this permit, the State Engineer reserves the right to hold public hearings to assist in determining the rights of the respective users in accordance with State law."

This water permit was approved by the

State Engineer on March 4, 1970.

Secretary Hoisveen stated that he felt it would be proper for re-affirmation of the approval of the U.S. Corps of Engineers water permit No. 1679.

Commissioner Dushinske moved the re-affirmation of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, water permit No. 1679, with the above stated language inserted on the application. Commissioner Dahl seconded and all members voted aye.

It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the other seven water permits presented to the Commission by the State Engineer, be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit. (See Appendix "F")

MEETING ADJOURNED

There being no further business, the metting was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.

Appendix "A"

Missouri River Bank Stabilization

WHEREAS, the bank erosion rectification works is needed in the reach of the Missouri River between the Oahe Reservoir and the Garrison Dam; and

WHEREAS, much of the bank erosion is traceable to the fluctuating releases made from the Garrison Dam to meet prior and navigation requirements for downstream uses; and

WHEREAS, the immediate need for remedial action has been ascertained by the Corps of Engineers, who have determined that such rectification has been estimated to cost \$5 million to avert impending disaster to: Interstate Highway No. 94; a large oil pipeline, which if broken, would cause severe pollution along the Missouri River as well as in the Oahe Reservoir; large blocks of fertile land; and municipal intake and outlet structures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission that the United States Congress is urged to authorize the expenditure of \$5 million or more to provide that this emergency be cared for as expeditiously as possible. The capacity to perform this work is within the capability of the Omaha District of the Corps of Engineers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Senators Milton R. Young and Quentin N. Burdick; Representatives Mark Andrews and Thomas Kleppe; Lt. General Frederick J. Clarke; Colonel O. H. Robinson; and Colonel B. P. Pendergrass.
