MINUTES

NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION

Held in Pembina City Hall Pembina, North Dakota

April 16, 1971

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 a.m. in the Pembina City Hall, Pembina, North Dakota, on April 16, 1971, with Vice Chairman Richard Gallagher presiding.

PRESENT:

Hoisveen, State Engineer, Chief Engineer and Secretary, North Dakota State Water Commission, Bismarck **OTHERS PRESENT:** Alan Grindberg, Assistant Chief Engineer, North Dakota State Water Commission, Bismarck Albert Christopher, Pembina A. Franklyn Barron, Mayor, Pembina George Brown, Chairman, Pembina County Water Management District, Cavalier William Grandy, Commissioner, Pembina County Water Management District, St. Thomas Robert W. Stenfors, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Paul Governor William L. Guy extended his regrets for being unable to attend the meeting of the State Water Commission being held in Pembina, North Dakota. Commissioner Jungroth moved that the MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 26, 1971 reading of the minutes of the February MEETING APPROVED 26, 1971 meeting be dispensed with and that they be approved as circulated. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye. Secretary Hoisveen presented the financial FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR statement for the month of March, 1971, MONTH OF MARCH, 1971 and commented on the condition of the APPROVED various funds. Commissioner Kramer moved that the financial. statement for the month of March, 1971, be approved as presented. Commissioner Hanson seconded and all members voted aye. Secretary Hoisveen then reported to the UNITED STATES-CANADA BOUNDARY Commission on the flooding situation in FLOODING SITUATION the Pembina River Basin with emphasis (#1169) on the area to the immediate west of

Pembina where the flooding was caused by a dike on the Canadian border.

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from Mr. Grant Trenbeath, which was addressed to Governor William L. Guy. In this letter, Mr. Trenbeath asked for a moratorium on drainage in the upper part of the Pembina River drainage basin until the Pembina Dam is built.

Vice Chairman Gallagher and Commissioner Jungroth suggested that a resolution be passed, much as the one that had been prepared, with a few amendments. Vice Chairman Gallagher read a letter from the municipality of Rhinelander, which indicated the attitude of the Canadian Government in regard to diking on the border. It was apparent from this letter that the situation is not likely to improve unless some sort of a resolution is forced on the local people by their Federal or Provincial Government.

> Commissioner Gray moved that Resolution 71-4-294, Order Prohibiting Drainage Within the Pembina River Basin, be adopted. Commissioner Hanson seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "A")

Secretary Hoisveen discussed the procedures that would be needed to obtain a resolution of the current situation on the Canadian border. Secretary Hoisveen stated that he felt that the International Joint Commission could ask the Souris-Red River Engineering Board to investigate into the problem and make recommendations to the International Joint Commission pursuant to the solution.

Secretary Hoisveen also reported on discussions conducted during his recent trip to Washington, D. C. There he called on the State Department and the International Joint Commission. He stated that it was obvious that neither of these agencies appeared very anxious to take any action in regard to this situation.

> Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commissioner adopt Resolution 71-4-295, International Joint Commission Study of Dike Conditions Along Canadian Border. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "B")

WEST RIVER DIVERSION (#1543)

The U. S. Bureau of Reclamation has asked the United States Congress for funds to study the water supply situation in the

west river area of North Dakota. They have asked the State Water Commission to support this request. They feel that water for a coal using industry in North Dakota could have an extremely high value, even high enough so that the diversion of waters from the Garrison Reservoir could be feasible.

> Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission pass Resolution 71-4-293, Supporting the Study by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation of the Diversion of Missouri River Waters into Western North Dakota, which affirms the support of the State Water Commission for a study of the diversion of waters. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "C")

Secretary Hoisveen presented a bill NORTH DAKOTA WATER USERS which had been received from the North ASSOCIATION DUES Dakota Water Users Association for services rendered for \$2,000. Commissioner Kramer moved that the State Water Commission approve the payment of this bill. Commissioner Hanson seconded and all members voted ave. Secretary Hoisveen presented the report MCLEAN COUNTY WATER of the State Engineer on the McLean MANAGEMENT DISTRICT County Water Management District. He (#1541) stated that the hearings had been held and that there had been no objection to the formation of a water management district in McLean County. Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission order the establishment of the McLean County Water Management District to include all of McLean County, and that Resolution 71-4-296, Authorizing the Establishment of McLean County Water Management District, be adopted. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye. (See Appendix "D") Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from NORTHWESTERN BELL TELEPHONE the Northwestern Bell Telephone Company COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CABLE asking for permission to install a CROSSING UNDER THE HEART cable across the Heart River south of RIVER SOUTH OF HEBRON Hebron. (#1373) Commissioner Jungroth moved that the State Water Commission approve the stream crossing by Northwestern Bell Telephone Company. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye. Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from SHEEP CREEK DAM the Elgin Days Committee formally DEDICATION requesting the State Water Commission (#1358) to hold a meeting in Elgin and participate in the dedication of Sheep Creek Dam on June 4, 1971. Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission accept the invitation. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye. STATE AUDITORS' REPORT Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission note the receipt OF STATE WATER COMMISSION of the report of the State Auditor, and RECORDS - JULY 1, 1969advise the Auditor of this action. JUNE 30, 1970 Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

REPORT ON FLOODING SITUATION IN THE PEMBINA RIVER BASIN (#1169) Vice Chairman Gallagher then called on Mr. Robert Stenfors, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Paul, to report on the current flooding situation in the Pembina River Basin. Mr. Stenfors

reported that the first crest at Neche reached a stage of 22.2 feet and that the second crest would be coming in approximately five days to a week and would reach a crest of 18 to 20 feet. The south dike along the Pembina River held, but the north dike broke allowing the water to flow along the Canadian border. The Canadian dike is holding. The Canadians call it a road, but really it is a dike with a one-way maintenance road on top; one pickup can drive along the top of it. There are culverts through it, however, the Canadians have covered the culverts with snowfences and haybales. Considerable discussion revolved around the situation regarding the diking in the basin.

REQUEST FOR PROGRAMMINGSecretary Hoisveen presented a letterACTIVITIES ON THEfrom the Water Resources ResearchCANNONBALL RIVERInstitute Director requesting additional(#262)funding to help maintain his staff so
that he can give proper assistance tothe State Water Commission in planning on the Cannonball River.Commissioner

Hanson noted that he felt that this planning was of vital importance to that area.

Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission contract with the Water Resources Research Institute in the amount of \$4,400 a year to allow the Institute to maintain the proper staff to assist in the planning. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye.

EMMONS, DUNN, GRANT AND SIOUX COUNTIES GROUND-WATER STUDIES (#948, 946 and 951) Secretary Hoisveen stated that requests had been received from four counties for county-wide ground-water studies. These would give us the three projects which we are able to undertake in the ensuing

year. Those counties from which requests have been received are Emmons County, Dunn County, Grant County and Sioux County. These later two will be conducted as one project. The total costs are as follows:

Commissioner Hanson moved that the State Water Commission approve the participation of these three ground-water study projects. Commissioner Jungroth seconded and all members voted aye.

PEMBINA COUNTY DRAINSecretary Hoisveen reported that thisNO. 5drain was originally constructed to(#1330)drain excess water into the Red Riverin 1898. It now needs complete

rehabilitation. The State Water Commission share of the proposed rehabilitation would be \$13,770.

Commissioner Gray moved that the State Water Commission participate in this drain in an amount not to exceed \$13,770. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

WILLOW CREEK ''KITZING-Secretary Hoisveen reported that theBLOCK'' CHANNEL CHANGEproposed channel change is located in(#820)lower Bottime au and upper McHenryCounties in the Willow Creek area. The

State Water Commission has been requested to participate in the cost sharing at an estimated amount of \$3,000. The work is to be performed at the local level with the State Water Commission supplying guidance to see that the work is performed in accordance with our specifications.

> Commissioner Kramer moved that the State Water Commission participate in the construction of this channel change at an estimated amount of \$3,000. Commissioner Gray seconded and all members voted aye.

WATER PERMITS NOS. 1744, 1748, 1749, 1750, 1751, 1752 and 1758 Secretary Hoisveen presented seven water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that these water permits be approved.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that the seven Conditional Permits be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit. (See Appendix "E")

EXPENSES FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SOURIS-RED-RAINY RIVER BASINS COMMISSION CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE (#305) Commissioner Hanson moved that this be placed on the agenda for the next meeting of the State Water Commission. Commissioner Kramer seconded and all members voted aye.

There being no further business, the

meeting adjourned at 1:15 p.m.

APPENDIX "A"

Order Prohibiting Drainage Within The Pembina River Basin

WHEREAS, the Pembina River, an international stream, drains thousands of acres of fertile farmland in Canada and the United States; and

WHEREAS, frequent flooding by the Pembina River has caused the loss of human life and millions of dollars in damage and destroyed crops, roads, bridges and buildings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota State Water Commission in its meeting held in Pembina, North Dakota, on this 16th day of April, 1971, by virtue of the authority vested in it by Section 61-02-14, North Dakota Century Code, does hereby prohibit and order the cessation of construction of drainage structures within the Pembina River Basin west of Highway No. 32 in North Dakota.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Order shall not apply to any legal drainage project designed by engineers employed by any federal, state or local governmental entity which is approved by the State Water Commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Order shall remain in effect until formally rescinded by the North Dakota State Water Commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Order shall be published in a newspaper having general circulation within the Pembina River Basin in North Dakota and copies shall also be forwarded to all County Commissioners, Township Supervisors Water Management Districts, Soil Conservation Districts and all local, state and federal officials and agencies concerned with or having an interest in or impact upon the water and related natural resources within the Pembina River Basin in North Dakota, and to the Honorable Ed Schreier, Premier of Manitoba, Canada.

APPENDIX "B"

International Joint Commission Study of Dike Conditions Along Canadian Border

WHEREAS, certain dikes constructed along the Canadlan-United States border between the Province of Manitoba and the State of North Dakota impair the natural flow of water within the Pembina River Basin between the two Nations; and

WHEREAS, such dikes have materially contributed to the flooding within the Pembina River Basin in North Dakota which flooding has caused immeasurable damages to farmland, crops, roads, bridges and buildings; and

WHEREAS, such dikes were constructed and are maintained in apparent violation of the Boundary Waters Treaty, 1909; and

WHEREAS, the International Joint Commission is empowered to act upon all such cases which apparently violate the Boundary Waters Treaty, 1909.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota State Water Commission at its regular meeting held in Pembina, North Dakota, on this 16th day of April, 1971, hereby respectfully requests the International Joint Commission, at its next executive meeting, to direct the Souris-Red River Engineering Board to conduct a study of all dikes constructed and maintained along the Canadian-United States border between the Province of Manitoba and the State of North Dakota and the impact of such dikes upon the flooding situation within the Pembina River Basin.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the North Dakota State Water Commission is hereby directed to forward copies of this Resolution to the Secretary of the Department of State; the Canadian Department of External Affairs, Ottawa; Chairmen of the Canadian and United States Sections of the International Joint Commission; U. S. Army Corps of Engineers; Commissioner, U. S. Bureau of Reclamation; Members of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation; the Minister

APPENDIX "C"

Supporting the Study by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation of the Diversion of Missouri River Waters into Western North Dakota

WHEREAS, the western portion of North Dakota is an extremely water-short area; and

WHEREAS, there exists in this area an abundance of lignite coal reserves; and WHEREAS, it is obvious that within a few years the industrial and power generating uses of this lignite will demand great amounts of water; and

WHEREAS, there are several proposals for studies to determine a more feasible method of moving water from Garrison Dam into this area; and

WHEREAS, one of these studies is to be conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation; and

WHEREAS, the North Dakota State Legislature has appropriated \$100,000 to the North Dakota State Water Commission to cooperate with federal agencies in causing such a study to be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission at its regular meeting held in Pembina, North Dakota, on this 16th day of April, 1971, that it does encourage the proposed study of the diversion of Missouri River waters into the headwaters of the western tributaries of North Dakota to be made by the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation and other United States agencies with the understanding that the aims and goals of such a study will be consistent with the aims and goals of the North Dakota State Water Commission and with the understanding that a close liaison be maintained with the State Water Commission.

RESOLUTION 71-4-296

Authorizing the Establishment of McLean County Water Management District

WHEREAS, McLean County, North Dakota, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners, on the 3rd day of March, 1971, filed with the North Dakota State Water Commission its petition requesting the establishment of a water management district embracing the territory within McLean County; and

WHEREAS, the report of the Chief Engineer of this Commission and the facts adduced at a public hearing held in the McLean County Courthouse on the 22nd day of March, 1971, disclosed that the investigation, regulation and conservation of water-bearing aquifers within McLean County can best be accomplished by a water management district in cooperation with state and federal agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota State Water Commission, in meeting duly assembled this 16th day of April, 1971, in Pembina, North Dakota, do hereby authorize and direct the Chairman and Secretary of this Commission to execute an Order establishing a water management district embracing the territory with McLean County and designated the McLean County Water Management District.
