MINUTES

North Dakota State Water Commission Held at M & J Steak House West Fargo, North Dakota

October 15, 1971

The meeting was called to order at 10:50 a.m. in the M & J Steak House, West Fargo, North Dakota, on October 15, 1971, with Vice Chairman Richard Gallagher presiding. The meeting held in West Fargo is indicative of the Commission's interest in holding meetings in areas where a specific problem exists or where their participation has made it possible to correct a problem in a particular locality. This meeting was held in West Fargo to display the Commission members' interest in the Sheyenne Diversion project. This project, which will provide the city of Fargo, through efforts of the North Dakota State Water Commission, to obtain 104 acre-feet of water daily from the Sheyenne River.

APPROVED	briefly explained various items therein.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the financial statement for the month of August, 1971, be approved as presented.

STUDY OF DROUGHT HISTORY AND PROBABILITIES (#322)

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Dr. E. B. Norum, Chairman, Soils Department, North Dakota State University, Fargo, was introduced by Secretary Hoisveen. Dr. Norum stated that his Department has applied

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to the Office of Water Resources Research for a grant to conduct a study entitled "Drought History and Probabilities in North Dakota." It is hoped that the study can be started on May 1, 1972, and be concluded on December 31, 1974. The entire study will cost \$45,995.70, and the State Water Commission is requested to contribute \$11,500. If the State Water Commission agrees to participate, it would be asked to make the following payment: \$1,500 between April, 1972 and June, 1972; \$5,000 between July 1, 1972 and June 30, 1973; and, \$5,000 between July 1, 1973 and June 30, 1974.

Dr. Norum introduced Dr. J. M. Ramirez, Assistant Professor of Soils, North Dakota State University, Fargo, who will be the principal investigator in charge of the proposed study. Dr. Ramirez, after briefly stating his qualifications and experience, explained the purpose and scope of the study. North Dakota has 228 climatic stations 94 of which have 22 years or more of record. These 94 stations will be utilized in the study. The study will look at drought from a climatic point of view and not from merely a single (i.e. farmer) point of view. It will define drought in terms of severity-time factor; the results will be extended in terms of probability, that is, periods of severity in terms of starting and ending. Basically, it will be a computer study with the data collected placed on magnetic tape. The procedure and data collected can be updated as the study progresses or at a later date.

In response to Commissioner Gray's question, Secretary Hoisveen stated that the State Water Commission has sufficient funds in its Contract Fund to pay the amount requested. It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the State Water Commission contribute \$11,500 to the North Dakota State University Soils Department's study on Drought History and Probabilities in North Dakota.

AQUATIC PLANT STUDY (#322)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that two years ago the State Water Commission agreed to contribute \$1,500 per year for a two-year

period to Dr. Leo J. Schermeister, North Dakota State University Pharmacy Department, for a study to determine the effects of aquatic plant life on water quality. Following Secretary Hoisveen's explanation of the purpose of the study and a brief discussion, Vice Chairman Gallagher suggested that the study should include an evaluation of the benefits of aquatic life.

> It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the State Water Commission contribute \$1,500 per year for a two-year period to the North Dakota State University for a study to determine the effects of aquatic life with the understanding that such contribution is dependent upon approval of a grant from Water Resources Research Institute.

LIGNITE RESEARCH (#1495) Secretary Hoisveen stated that the University of North Dakota was interested in conducting a study relative to the use of North Dakota's

lignite. The State Water Commission could utilize the information such a study would collect in its West River Diversion study. The principal use of the study would be for locating suitable areas and processes whereby lignite could be used in a hydro-gasification process. He indicated that several large natural gas utility companies have shown considerable interest in North Dakota.

> It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the State Water Commission will contribute \$12,500 to the University of North Dakota's lignite research provided the balance of the project is funded by the Office of Coal Research and/or the National Science Foundation.

BARNES COUNTY DRAIN NO. 2 (#1558)

Secretary Hoisveen explained that the Barnes County Water Management District, in its plans for the construction of the Anderson-Stewart South Drain, had not met State

Water Commission requirements for financial participation by the Commission. It has now agreed to adopt State Water Commission construction specifications and secure the approval of the State Game and Fish Department. It is estimated that the cost of the drain will be approximately \$44,000.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the State Water Commission participate in 40 percent of the costs of the Barnes County Drain No. 2, an amount not to exceed \$17,600, provided the Barnes County Water Management District comply with State Water Commission construction specifications and secure the approval of the State Game and Fish Department.

BILLINGS COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT (#1555)

Vice Chairman Gallagher called on Cliff Jochim, Special Assistant Attorney General for the State Water Commission, to discuss the situation relative to the establishment of the Billings County Water Management

District. Mr. Jochim stated that on July 16, 1971, he held a hearing in Medora on the petition of the Board of County Commissioners of Billings County to establish a county-wide water management district. Three people, in addition to Mr. Jochim, attended the hearing; a County Commissioner, the County Auditor and a disgruntled farmer. None of them favored the establishment of a district. At its September 1, 1971 meeting, the State Water Commission decided to defer the establishment of the district until more interest is exhibited on the local level.

> It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the approval of the petition to establish the Billings County Water Management District be deferred and Cliff Jochim be directed to arrange a meeting with the Board of County Commissioners and discuss the situation.

SOUTHEAST CASS WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM (#729)

Daniel R. Twichell, Secretary, Southeast Cass County Water Management District, requested that the State Water Commission adopt a resolution approving the District's

proposal to construct a sewer and water supply system south of West Fargo. He explained that approval of the proposal was merely the initial step necessary to initiate the project and the State Water Commission would have to approve the District's final detailed plan before actual construction could be started.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the State Water Commission adopt a resolution approving the proposal of the Southeast Cass County Water Management District to construct a sewer and water supply system south of West Fargo. (See Appendix "A")

SOURIS RIVER CHANNEL GROUNDBREAKING (#1408)

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from the Minot Chamber of Commerce inviting the State Water Commission to participate in the groundbreaking ceremonies on

October 20, 1971, for a Souris River flood control project. It was the consensus of those present that the State Water Commission need not hold a meeting in conjunction with the dedication ceremonies, but any individual Commissioner that wished to attend should do so.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Gray and carried that any member of the State Water Commission who wished was authorized to attend the October 20, 1971 groundbreaking ceremonies.

STATE AUDITOR'S REPORT

Secretary Hoisveen read a letter from State Auditor, Curtis Olson, which accompanied a report made by his

personnel of State Water Commission books covering the Commission's financial activities from July 1, 1970 to June 30, 1971. The report is very favorable and indicates that all aspects of the State . Water Commission's financial activities are satisfactory.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissiolner Kramer and carried that Secretary Hoisveen be requested to notify the State Auditor that his report has been reviewed by the Commission and its staff.

HALLIDAY GROUND-Secretary Hoisveen stated that the StateWATER STUDYWater Commission had received a request(#1599)from the city of Halliday for a ground-
water survey in order to locate amunicipal water supply.The survey would be conducted within a three-mile

radius of Halliday, would be completed this fall and is estimated to cost \$3,000. The Commission, in the past, has participated in one-half of the cost of such surveys.

It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the State Water Commission conduct a ground-water survey for the city of Halliday and participate in one-half of the costs, such cost sharing not to exceed \$1,500.

BIG COULEE SPILLOUT (#1316)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that the State Water Commission had received a request from the Towner County Water Management District for financial participation in

the construction of a dike along a portion of Big Coulee which is subject to spillout. The dike is estimated by the Soil Conservation Service to cost \$3,000 and the State Water Commission is asked to share in 40 percent of such costs. Secretary Hoisveen warned that before agreeing to participate, the State Water Commission should be aware that such action might establish a precedent and encourage other areas with similar problems to request cost sharing for dike construction.

> It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Hanson and carried that the State Water Commission will pay 40 percent of the cost of constructing a dike along Big Coulee in Towner County, the amount not to exceed \$1,200, with the stipulation that the Towner County Water Management District assume all responsibility for any damages resulting from the construction or maintenance of such dike.

EFFECTS OF DRAINAGE ON FLOODING (#1053) Assistant Chief Engineer, Alan Grindberg, stated that he had written a memo to Mr. Secretary Hoisveen in which he questioned the seriously detrimental effects of most

drainage on damaging floods and suggested that a study be conducted to determine the actual effect. After a brief discussion, it was agreed that no State Water Commission action was required at this time and it might have to be delayed for one year as it is too late to submit it to the Water Resources Research Institute. It might also be submitted to the National Science Foundation.

CASS COUNTY DRAINMr. Duane Breitling, Attorney, Cass CountyDROP STRUCTURESDrainage Board, stated that the majority(#1063)of the drainage from northwest and southwest

of Cass County collects in the southeast two-thirds of Cass County where it spills into the Red River. The county's older drains were not constructed with drop structures and as a result a tremendous amount of erosion is now taking place. When requested to participate financially in the construction of such drop structures the State Water Commission has regarded such construction as drain improvements and contributed a maximum of 40 percent of their cost. The Cass County Drain Board is of the opinion that these drop structures should have been part of the drains' original construction and, therefore, should now be regarded as original projects rather than improvements of existing drains. Mr. Breitling requested that this be made a part of a future State Water Commission meeting's agenda and be considered at that time in more detail. The Cass County Drain Board will provide additional information upon request.

> Vice Chairman Gallagher directed the State Water Commission staff to study the matter and determine the estimated related costs.

WATER PERMIT NOS. 1777, 1779, 1786, 1787, 1790, 1792, 1794, 1797, 1798, and 1800

Secretary Hoisveen presented 10 water permits to the Commission for consideration. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that these water permits be approved as presented. It was noted that water permit No.

1790 was approved by the State Engineer on September 7, 1971, due to the fact that the city of LaMoure requested approval following the hearing so as to begin construction of the project.

> It was moved by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Kramer and carried that the 10 water permits be approved as presented. (See Appendix "B")

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 12:35 p.m. Following lunch, the Commission participated in the groundbreaking dedication ceremonies for construction of the Sheyenne River Diversion project.
