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#### MINUTES

North Dakota State Water Commission Meeting Held At Holiday Inn (Burgundy Room) Minot, North Dakota

April 15, 1977

The North Dakota State Water Commission held a meeting on April 15, 1977, at the Holiday Inn, Minot, North Dakota. Alvin Kramer, Acting Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to present the agenda.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES
OF MARCH 24, 1977 MEETING APPROVED

Secretary Fahy reviewed the uncirculated minutes of the March 24, 1977 meeting and discussed the proceedings that took place.

It was moved by Commissioner Just, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the minutes be approved as presented.

CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST FROM MOUNTRAIL WATER USERS ASSOCIATION FOR STATE PARTICIPATION IN GROUND-WATER STUDY IN COUNTIES OF MOUNTRAIL, WARD AND MCLEAN (SWC Project No. 1675)

Mr. Ray Riersgard, President of the Mountrail Water Users Association, presented a request for 50 percent financial participation in the amount of \$20,300 of an estimated \$40,600 study for ground-water supplies for their rural water district. Mr.

Riersgard stated that the area of the district covers all of Mountrail County except the northwest corner, five miles into McLean County, and twelve miles into Ward County, and that the district had some 800 members including seven or eight cities.

Mr. Willard Webster, Consulting Engineer, explained economic reasons preventing the use of water from Lake Sakakawea.

Secretary Fahy stated that financial assistance could not be in accordance with regular Commission policy because our staff workload precludes our doing the study.

It was moved by Commissioner Just that the Commission approve an exception to the regular policy, and that it participate financially in an amount up to \$20,300 for a consultant study under the guidelines and coordination of the State Water Commission staff, subject to the availability of funds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lanz. All members voted aye; the motion carried.

REQUEST FROM GRAND FORKS COUNTY DRAIN BOARD FOR STATE WATER COMMISSION COST SHARING FOR GRAND FORKS COUNTY DRAIN NO. 42 (SWC Project No. 1641)

cleared by the Attorney General.

Secretary Fahy presented a delayed request from the Grand Forks County Drain Board for financial participation up to 40 percent, or \$55,900 of qualified construction costs. He stated that the drain design had been approved and that an earlier legal problem had been

It was moved by Commissioner Lanz to approve financial participation for the Grand Forks County Drain No. 42 up to 40 percent of qualified construction costs, not to exceed \$55,900 subject to the availability of funds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gray. All members voted aye, and the motion carried.

RED RIVER DIKING DISCUSSION AND RESOLUTION FROM GRAND FORKS COUNTY (SWC Project No. 1638)

Secretary Fahy read a resolution adopted February 17, 1977, by the Grand Forks County Commissioners supporting the efforts of private diking along the Red River to protect agricultural land.

He explained previous history of the dike construction.

Steve Hoetzer, Dave Sprynczynatyk and Murray Sagsveen reviewed the diking problem by use of topographic maps and photos.

A request was made by Grand-Walsh Association members to dike a breakout of the Red River near the Marais River and control floodwaters along the same river to a dike and outlet structure where the Turtle River along with the Marais River flows enter the Red River near Manyel.

A discussion followed regarding the request. Discussed were water management district responsibilities, public hearings and alternatives.

The consensus of the Commission was that they could approve a request for the Marais and Turtle Rivers project if the local water management districts became involved. The involvement would include public hearings and recommendations. The request should not be presented in a manner that would affect the ability of the Water Commission to deal with the Red River diking problem.

A draft of preliminary criteria for Red River dike construction was reviewed. Possible legal actions were discussed by Murray Sagsveen.

The Commission requested the staff to develop legal or other alternatives for future decisions relative to the diking problem. The Commission also requested Mr. Sagsveen to meet with the Corps of Engineers concerning its jurisdiction over diking activities on the Red River.

YELLOWSTONE RIVER LEVEL "B" STUDY (SWC Project No. 1507)

Commissioner Wilhelm reported on the planned activity for the next meeting of the study group, which is to review

recommendations from agencies and interested persons. She circulated copies of the recommendations for the Platte River Level "B" Study along with copies of recommendations that she has made.

STATEWIDE DRAINAGE AND FLOOD CONTROL DISCUSSION (SWC Project No. 1053)

Secretary Fahy reported that, under drainage and flood control, new legislation (H.B. 1441) has been passed to allow organization of two

or more water management districts to solve common watershed problems. He cited also the authority to levy two mills for the projects in joint venture.

He recommended that the districts use the new authority and that this was being stressed during the current area water management meetings.

Murray Sagsveen advised that the water management district mill levy had been increased from three to four mills by the legislature. The legislature also approved a measure increasing from 40 to 80 acres the maximum area that could be drained without a permit.

The Commission advised the State Engineer that it would limit its financial participation in drainage to new construction and that greater detail must be provided to justify future requests for drainage projects.

SOIL AND WATER COMPATIBILITY FOR IRRIGATION (SWC Project No. 1400) Secretary Fahy reported on a meeting held by the U. S. Soil Conservation Service to discuss standards that may be used in determining compatibility for irrigation. The meeting included

federal and state agencies involved, as well as soils specialists.

All agreed to the need, but Secretary Fahy reported on the difficulty of establishing acceptable standards. A task force is currently working on the problem.

Under discussion, it was suggested that soil and water compatibility information, if available, should appear on the water permit agenda.

Standards, when developed, will be

presented to the Commission.

DISCUSSION OF WATER
USE FEES
(SWC Project No. 1400)

Murray Sagsveen circulated a draft, for discussion purposes, of proposed rules and regulations governing water use fees. He cited the past legislation

authorizing water fees and new legislation to strengthen the position of the State Engineer and the Commission. He also noted that the recent industrial water permits were granted along with contracts calling for water use fees.

Discussions were held relative to the extent of charges in terms of present or past use.

A special meeting is to be scheduled to complete recommended rules and regulations.

CONSIDERATION OF WATER PERMIT REQUESTS (SWC Project No. 1400)

Secretary Fahy presented APPENDIX "A" representing the water permit agenda for the Commission's consideration.

Permit No. 2511 for William Huether was considered first. Action on Permit No. 2511 was deferred at the last meeting.

Secretary Fahy read the conditions related to recommendation to grant an additional 150.0 acres in Section 36, Township 134 North, Range 60 West, and 300.0 acres in Section 32, Township 133 North, Range 60 West.

Discussions were held relative to aquifer conditions and basis for recommendation.

It was moved by Commissioner Just to divide the permit for separate action at each location. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Wilhelm. All members voted aye; the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer to approve 225.0 acre-feet annually for 150.0 acres in the NEt of Section 36. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gray. The motion carried by a four to two roll call vote.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, and seconded by Commissioner Kramer, to approve 450.0 acre-feet to irrigate 300.0 acres in the E½ of Section 32. All members voted aye; the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Wilhelm to approve the balance of water permits listed on the agenda as recommended by the State Engineer, deferring action on Water Permit No. 2696, which is Husky Industries, Inc. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gray.

Under discussion of the motion, it was explained by Commissioner Wilhelm that the pollution situation caused by the Husky plant had not been corrected in spite of Health Department efforts.

On the call of the question, all members voted aye; the motion carried. The following water permits were approved, subject to conditions indicated on each respective request: No. 2711 - Carl A. Murray Sagsveen was asked to look into the status of pollution control at the plant site and report back to the Commission, relative to water permit No. 2696.

LEGISLATIVE STATUS
REPORT

Murray Sagsveen circulated copies of the final status of legislation of direct or indirect interest to the Commission.

Discussions centered on Senate Bill 2062 which was the legislative study recommendations for appropriation of water.

Commissioner Wilhelm cited Commission responsibilities in light of a recent letter indicating the Public Service Commission's facility siting authority may be limited.

CONSIDERATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENT

A financial report was given by Secretary Fahy and Matt Emerson. Limited travel funds were discussed.

Vice Chairman Gallagher requested that percentage of contract funds encumbered be also shown on the Account Budget Summary.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer to acknowledge receipt of the financial statement as presented. Commissioner Lanz seconded the motion, and all members voted aye. The motion carried.

DISCUSSION ON ACREAGE LIMITATIONS FOR IRRIGATION (SWC Project No. 1400) Draft copies, for discussion purposes, of Acreage Limitations for Irrigation Water Permittees were circulated by Murray Sagsveen.

Discussions followed regarding various points of view. Further consideration will be discussed after more proposals are presented by Commission staff.

Some of the considerations from this meeting's discussions are: time limitations, irrigation district approach, and an acreage limitation plus time moratorium for balance when considering water permit filings having large acreage requests.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 p.m.
