The North Dakota State Water Commission held a meeting on March 16, 1978, in the Large Hearing Room of the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota. Governor-Chairman, Arthur A. Link, called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to present the agenda.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES
OF DECEMBER 7, 1977 MEETING APPROVED

Secretary Fahy reviewed the minutes of the December 7, 1977 meeting held in Grand Forks, North Dakota, and updated the Commission on several of the items.

After discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the minutes of the December 7, 1977 meeting be approved as presented and distributed.

CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST
BY STEELE COUNTY WMD FOR
FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION FOR
CONSTRUCTION OF STEELE COUNTY
DRAIN NO. 6 (RYGG SLOUGH)
(SWC Project No. 1665)

Secretary Fahy presented a request from the Steele County Water Management District for financial participation in the construction of Steele County Drain No. 6, also known as Rygg Slough. Applying normal participation procedures, the State Water Commission's share in the project would amount to \$22,974.00.

It was recommended by the State Engineer that the Commission honor this request and approve 40 percent of qualified construction costs in an amount not to exceed \$22,974.00, contingent upon the following items: 1) the Steele County Water Management Board shall establish the project as a legal drain; 2) the Steele County Water Management Board shall establish a water management plan for the Rygg Slough Watershed. This plan must not allow additional drainage into Rygg Slough so the capacity of the legal drain will not be exceeded; and 3) upon legal drain approval, the Steele County Water Management Board shall enter into an agreement with the Water Commission for completion of final design plans and specifications, contract administration, and construction inspection by the Water Commission staff.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Just, and carried, that the Commission approve financial participation in an amount not to exceed \$22,974.00, contingent upon the availability of funds; and also contingent upon the three conditions stated by Secretary Fahy, for the construction of the Steele County Drain No. 6.

CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST FROM NELSON COUNTY WMD FOR FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION FOR ENTERPRISE TOWNSHIP LEGAL DRAIN NO. 1 (SWC Project No. 1131) Secretary Fahy presented a request from the Nelson County Water Management District for financial participation for Enterprise Township Legal Drain No. 1 (formerly Larson Group Diversion). The drain has a watershed of approximately 12 square miles and extends south from

Walsh-Nelson County line to southern end of Enterprise Township. The project will have an approach channel of 3600 feet to a pumping station. The approach channel will drain a large flat in Sections 14 and 23, Township 154 North, Range 59 West. This flat acts as a sump for the entire watershed. The pump station will lift the water from the 3600-foot approach channel approximately 8 feet into a 12-foot open channel. This channel is 24,000 feet long ending at the headwater of Sarnia Dam in Section 20, Township 154 North, Range 50 West. Sarnia Dam will act as the final control for the project. The State Water Commission's share in the project would amount to approximately \$12,660.00.

It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that the Commission approve participation in this project predicated on two conditions: 1) a detailed operation plan be submitted to the State Water Commission which explains who shall control the operation of the pump and who will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the pump; and 2) that provision be made for the maintenance of Sarnia Dam.

It was moved by Commissioner Lanz, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that the Commission approve participation for Enterprise Township Legal Drain No. 1 in an amount not to exceed \$12,660.00, contingent upon the availability of funds; and contingent on the two conditions indicated by the State Engineer.

CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST FROM TRAILL COUNTY DRAIN BOARD FOR FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION IN THE ROSEVILLE FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT (SWC Project No. 1238) Secretary Fahy presented a request from the Traill County Drain Board for financial participation in the Roseville Flood Control project, which consists of approximately one mile of critical area treatment and seven miles of channel improvement. The project is located two miles west of

Portland, North Dakota. Qualified construction costs of the project would amount to approximately \$24,000.00 for the State Water Commission's share.

It was recommended by the State Engineer that the Commission honor this request from Traill County and approve financial participation.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the Commission approve financial participation for the Roseville Flood Control project in an amount not to exceed \$24,000.00, contingent upon the availability of funds.

DISCUSSION OF PROVISIONS
OF SECTION 404 OF THE CLEAN
WATER ACT RELATING TO DREDGE
AND FILL OPERATIONS

Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (formerly the Federal Water Pollution Control Act of 1972) requires a permit from the Corps of Engineers before the discharge of any dredged or fill material into navigable waters.

Section 404 was extensively amended in 1977. One amendment provides for the Governor to submit a plan to the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency for state administration and enforcement of Section 404 permits. That amendment provides, in part:

"The Governor of any State desiring to administer its own individual and general permit program for the discharge of dredged or fill material into the navigable waters (excluding those waters traditionally navigable) within its jurisdiction may submit to the Administration a full and complete description of the program it proposes to establish and administer under the State law, or under an inter-state compact. In addition, such state shall submit a statement from the Attorney General ... that the laws of such State ... provide adequate authority to carry out the described program."

Secretary Fahy indicated that he and members of his staff have discussed this at great length and it appears that there will be a need for some legislation and also a need for determination as to whether the State actually should take over the permitting program. It was suggested by the State Engineer that the Commission consider urging the Governor to request a Legislative Council Committee study of the 404 program in order to get the various legislators acquainted with the complexities of the program and to arrive at a recommendation as to whether or not the State should administer the program.

In discussion, Governor Link read the Summary of a memo to the State Engineer from the Legal Division, which states:

"Although the 1977 regulations will require some changes to reflect the Clean Water Act of 1977 amendments to Section 404, it would appear that they would be very minimal. For example, requirements of federal agencies to obtain 404 permits will be deleted, and dredge and fill definitions will be changed to reflect some exemptions. Since the Corps will be requested to submit comments on a proposed state program, I would expect that the Corps would reject or comment unfavorably on a proposed state program which varies from the July 19, 1977 regulations. In light of this assumption that a proposed state program will have to be very stringent to be approved, and in light of the requirements in the Clean Water Act of 1977 for a state program, a state 404 program may turn out to be very cumbersome."

Governor Link also indicated that he would support the suggestion of requesting a Legislative Council Committee study of the 404 program.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the Commission urge the Chairman to recommend to the Legislative Council Committee that a study be made of the Section 404 program.

CONSIDERATION OF WATER PERMIT REQUESTS (SWC Project No. 1400)

Secretary Fahy presented APPENDIX "A", which represents the water permit agenda, for the Commission's consideration.

There was considerable discussion concerning Casnet Co. of Claremont, South Dakota, who have three requests for permits appearing on the agenda. Permit No. 2917 requests 320.0 acre-feet of water to irrigate 160.0 acres; Permit No. 2918 requests 640.0 acre-feet to irrigate 320.0 acres, and Permit No. 2919 requests 1280.0 acre-feet to irrigate 640.0 acres.

One of the concerns expressed was whether the rapid expansion rate was related to investment purposes and possible speculative reasons, or whether they are actual operators who want to develop the land, use it, and reside within the community?

Milton Lindvig, Director of Hydrology for the State Water Commission, stated that water permit No. 2932, Gaylen Schmidt of Minot, North Dakota, lists a recommendation on the agenda for 132.6 acre-feet to irrigate 88.4 acres. He requested that the Commission consider amending this recommendation to read a total of 325.1 acre-feet to irrigate 223.4 acres.

Following considerable discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Gallagher that the Commission confirm the action of the State Engineer as recommended. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kramer.

During discussion of the motion, Commissioner Wilhelm stated that the Commission has to understand the State Engineer's and the staff's position in making recommendations to the Commission on an application, but she noted that the existence of the Commission itself is testimony to the fact that the Commission needs to make some other considerations regarding the social type of enforcement. She stated that while it is a courtesy to the staff and the State Engineer to consider each application and automatically okay them, she feels that there are many ways in which the Commission has power or responsibility that the State Engineer and the staff do not have. She also indicated that the Commission is confronted with a completed list on the last day in which to make a decision.

Commissioner Wilhelm requested the Commission to further consider the three Casnet Co.'s applications, mainly based upon the fact that she felt the Commission did not have ample time to make a firm decision.

Secretary Fahy indicated that it was basically never intended that the Water Commission itself would analyze a water permit. The reason that water permits are brought before the Commission has its basis in history when it was decided that it would be a courtesy to the Water Commission to have them look at the permits. There is no requirement in the law that the Water Commission analyze the permits as such. The permitting system was setup in 1905 and the Water Commission in 1936. This is the basis of trying to keep the Water Commission informed of the State Engineer's actions.

Secretary Fahy also indicated that if the Commission wants something besides the technical analysis of the ability of a source to satisfy demands without impact, and if they want to bring other things into that decision, which was never contemplated in the law, the Commission does have the authority to adopt guidelines which would not enfringe on the State Engineer's powers of issuing a water permit. It would merely set broad policy parameters. If the Commission wishes to restrict the amount of water that is included in a permit, it can be done in a number of ways - one of which the Commission is considering at this time by adopting acreage limitations.

There being no further discussion on the motion, the Chairman called the question. Commissioners Gallagher, Kramer, Gray, Lanz and Just voted aye. Commissioner Wilhelm abstained from voting. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION OF ACREAGE LIMITATIONS FOR IRRIGATED LAND (SWC Project No. 1400) Secretary Fahy briefly reviewed the background discussions for the proposed acreage limitations.

Commissioner Just distributed and discussed a proposal for acreage limitations, attached hereto as APPENDIX "B", Rules and Regulations of the North Dakota State Water Commission Proposed to be Adopted Pursuant to Title 61 of the North Dakota Century Code Governing the Use of Water for Irrigation Purposes. Commissioner Just indicated that this proposal is a hybrid of a number of the other proposals which have been previously discussed.

The Commission recessed at 12:00 noon and the meeting was reconvened at 1:45 p.m. The discussion on proposed acreage limitations continued.

It was moved by Commissioner Just that the State Water Commission hold a public hearing in April on these proposed regulations governing the use of water for irrigation purposes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lanz.

 $\hbox{After a discussion on the number of hearings} \\ \hbox{to be held and places in which to hold the hearings -} \\$

Commissioner Just amended his original motion to state that the State Water Commission hold one or more public hearings on these proposed regulations governing the use of water for irrigation, and that at least one of the public hearings be held in Jamestown. The amended motion also received a second from Commissioner Lanz.

The motion was further amended by Commissioner Just that the State Water Commission hold two public hearings in April on these proposed regulations governing the use of water for irrigation purposes and that one of the hearings be held in Jamestown and the other hearing be held in Mandan. Commissioner Lanz seconded this amendment.

Governor Link then invited comments from interested persons in the audience who wished to comment on the discussion.

Mr. Tom Daniels, Oakes, ND, commended the Commission for taking a step in a direction to do something about water allocations in North Dakota and stated that he is in favor of having meetings throughout the irrigation areas of the State to receive input from individuals.

Mr. Allen Hansen, Ludden, ND, indicated that he would like to see the meetings held in Jamestown and other areas of the state.

Mr. Ken Lohstreeter indicated that there are several irrigation districts throughout the state and suggested that maybe these meetings could be held near those areas.

(Individual who did not state his name) indicated that he would like to commend the Water Commission also and feel they are going in the right direction to maintain orderly development of the State's water resources. He indicated that one state-wide meeting should be sufficient.

Secretary Fahy indicated that the format to be followed for adopting rules and regulations will include that the notice of public hearings be published in each county newspaper of the State for two consecutive weeks prior to the hearing.

Discussion then pursued on the creation of irrigation districts, and general discussion regarding the proposal.

The Chairman then called the question on the amended motion. All members voted aye and the motion was declared passed.

DISCUSSION CONCERNING RED RIVER DIKING (SWC Project No. 1638) Dave Sprynczynatyk, Director of Engineering for the State Water Commission, distributed copies and discussed report entitled "Red River of the North, Main Stem, Hydrologic

Data", prepared by the Corps of Engineers at the joint request of the State Water Commission and the Department of Natural Resources of Minnesota. This report contains an overview of information available now regarding the agriculture dikes in the area and a historical overview of the flooding in that area.

He also distributed copies of the Joint and Cooperative Agreement for the Establishment of Criteria for Authorizing Dikes and Other Flood Control Structures and Measures on the Red River of the North and the Bois De Sioux River. This agreement was signed in 1976 and states that the two States will jointly develop criteria to be used in administering permits for agriculture dikes along the Red River.

Also distributed were copies of the proposed criteria called the First Amendment to the Agreement, which is hereby attached to these minutes and labeled as APPENDIX "C". Hearings will be held on April 25 and 26, 1978 on these criteria, and it was suggested that as many of the Commission members who could attend these hearings should do so. Also attached hereto is the News Release regarding the public hearings, labeled as APPENDIX "D".

CONSIDERATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR WATER MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES IN MINED-LAND AREAS Copies were distributed to the Commission members on proposed Rules and Regulations of the North Dakota State Water Commission and the North Dakota State Engineer Proposed to be Adopted Pursuant to Title 61 of the

North Dakota Century Code Governing Water Resources on Surface Mining Areas.

Service Commission approached the State Water Commission, the State Health Department and the State Workmen's Compensation Bureau relative to joining in the promulgation of rules and regulations controlling development in mined-land areas. Their major reason for wanting other state agencies involved is because the Public Service Commission lacks jurisdiction to implement the federal requirements. If these three agencies join with the Public Service Commission there are adequate authorities for carrying out the concepts of the federal legislation.

Mr. Mike Dwyer, Legal Counsel for the State Water Commission, explained that the proposed Rules and Regulations require a water management plan be submitted and approved by the State Engineer in conjunction with the mining permit application submitted to the Public Service Commission.

The water management plan proposed to be required will serve three functions:

1) It will facilitate the processing and consideration of permit applications for various water management devices for coal mining operations. Presently, coal mining operators must secure several permits relating to water management, including drainage permits (61-01-22), permits for impoundments (61-02-20 and 61-16-15), and permits for diversion structures (61-16-15);

- 2) It will insure that the interrelated activities affecting both ground and surface hydrology are considered in total in the preparation and design of a surface coal mining operation. The newly enacted Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977 (P.L. 95-87) as well as the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 (P.L. 92-500) require stringent water quality controls on coal mining operations. Such water quality controls are usually met by a number of sedimentation ponds, diversion, and other water management type structures. The effect is a significant alteration in the flow and quantity of both surface and ground water; and
- 3) It will provide a method by which water related problems can be resolved and dealt with on the coal mining site itself rather than as the water flows off and downstream from surface coal mining operations.

A joint hearing was held with the Public Service Commission on March 13, 1978 on the Section of the Rules and Regulations related to the State Water Commission at which time comments from the public were received. Mr. Dwyer stated that the record had been left open until the end of March to receive additional comments or changes from interested people.

Commissioner Wilhelm discussed several changes that she desired to make to the proposed Rules and Regulations and requested that they be formally presented to the Public Service Commission before the end of March. Her recommended changes are:

Under Section 84-04-01-06. Definitions 5. "Commission" means State Water Commission. Commissioner Wilhelm would like to more precisely define who the State Water Commission is.

Mr. Dwyer suggested that the definition of the State Water Commission be extended to include the Governor, the Commissioner of Agriculture and five appointed citizen members.

It was moved by Commissioner Wilhelm, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the definition of the State Water Commission be changed as suggested by Mr. Dwyer.

Under Section 84-04-02-01. Filing Initial Water Management Plan, it was suggested by Commissioner Wilhelm that the last sentence "Such review shall be complete not more than 60 days from the date of receipt of a complete application" be changed to read "Such review shall be complete when possible not more than 60 days from the date of receipt of a complete application."

It was moved by Commissioner Wilhelm, seconded by Commissioner Just, and carried, that this change be forwarded to the Public Service Commission.

Section 84-04-01. Protection of the Hydrologic System. Commissioner Wilhelm would like to identify more specifically the word "minimize" in the last sentence of that paragraph. (This was only discussed, no decision or motion was made relative to more specifically identifying "minimize".)

Section 84-04-07-05. Inspection. All ponds, including those not meeting the size or other criteria of this chapter shall be examined for structural weakness, erosion, and other hazardous conditions. Commissioner Wilhelm suggested that "who" shall be identified that will examine for structural weakness, erosion and other hazardous conditions.

During discussion, it was determined that the Public Service Commission would be the examining agency responsible.

Commissioner Wilhelm stated that this report indicated that there is a concern of the use of coal ash in reclamation. The report states that when coal ash is used in backfilling operations and when the ash comes in contact with water it undergoes solidification leading to excessive salinity and high PH values. In view of this statement, Commissioner Wilhelm suggested that it be recommended to the Public Service Commission that they consider the addition of more specific language concerning the potential damages from the use of coal ash.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Wilhelm, seconded by Commissioner Gallagher, and carried, that the State Water Commission recommend to the Public Service Commission that they consider establishing a regulation addressing the potential damages from the use of coal ash in backfilling operations.

Section 84-04-11-01. Water Rights and Replacement. Commissioner Wilhelm suggested that when a water right is lost from mining operations, the burden of proof for damages should lie with the Company, and that the Public Service Commission be requested to make some specific guidelines regarding damages to the landowners.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Wilhelm and seconded by Commissioner Gallagher that Section 84-04-11-01. Protection of Water Rights, read with the recommended changes inserted as follows:

"The permittee shall forthwith replace

both the quantity and quality of the water supply of an owner of interest in real property who obtains all or part of his supply of water for domestic, agricultural, industrial, or other legitimate use from an underground or surface source where such supply has been affected by contamination, diminution or interruption proximately resulting from surface coal mine operation by the permittee. Upon receipt of a complaint by such owner that his water supply has been so affected, the State Engineer, upon determining that such be the fact, shall forthwith issue an order for the permittee to replace such water supply." At the call of the question by the Chairman, all members voted aye; motion carried.

It was suggested by Mr. Sagsveen that if any of the Commission members want different language for any one of the rules, they could meet with the Legal staff of the Water Commission to draft alternatives which will be sent out to the Commission members for their consideration, and Commission action could be taken at the next meeting.

Secretary Fahy noted that the record on the proposed rules and regulations is being held open until March 31, 1978, and after that time the recommended changes by the Commission members will be incorporated into the Rules and Regulations and then it will be necessary for some adoption procedures after the first of April.

PROGRESS REPORT ON STUDY TO DELIVER WATER IN SOUTHWESTERN NORTH DAKOTA (SWC Project No. 1674)

Dave Sprynczynatyk updated the Commission members on the study of delivering water to southwestern North Dakota, noting that at the December meeting of the Commission a Plan of Study was discussed and also

the work that was being done with the rural water districts in that area in regard to surveying the water needs.

Since that meeting, the three rural water districts have began to gather survey information. To date, the Commission has received approximately 1100 survey forms from the Southwest Rural Water District, which is composed of Slope, Bowman, Hettinger and Adams Counties. There are approximately 2000 farms in the area and they had hoped to survey 1800, or 90 percent of the farms.

Mr. Sprynczynatyk indicated that no completed forms had been received to date from the other two rural water districts. Due to winter weather conditions, the deadline has been extended to May to obtain this information.

Similar survey forms were sent to each of the cities in the 14-county area. Fifty-four cities were contacted and forty-one

completed survey forms have been received. The remaining 13 cities will be contacted to see why they haven't returned their survey and to give assistance if they need it in completing the form.

It was originally planned to hire one engineer to work with existing State Water Commission engineers to do the preliminary pipeline design. The existing staff engineers did not have the available time to work on the project and also in trying to hire someone, difficulty was encountered because of the short time schedule (approximately 18 months). Thus, a decision was made in February, 1978, to hire a consultant to do the engineering work of this study. Thirty engineering firms were contacted and asked to submit a proposal to do the work. Ten proposals were received, which were screened, and four consulting firms will be interviewed March 17, of which one firm will be selected to do the engineering work and also the environmental and economic working requirements.

Mr. Sprynczynatyk also mentioned that back in October, 1977, contracts were sent to the three rural water districts and as of this date, none of the contracts have been returned.

Mr. Jim Ketterling, Missouri West Rural Water District, indicated that the work will be completed as the contract requires since the deadline has been extended until May.

SELECTION OF REGULAR STATE WATER COMMISSION MEETING DATES

Secretary Fahy suggested that the Commission consider establishing an orderly procedure for holding Water Commission meetings by designating a certain day(s) of a certain week each month.

After discussing and polling the Commission members of their desired day(s) and week, it was the consensus of the Commission that the designation of a specific day(s) and week be left to the discretion of the Governor and the State Engineer.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR WATER MARKETING

Secretary Fahy commented on the memo dated May 27, 1977, prepared by the Legal Counsel for the Commission, and also on a draft of Rules and Regulations of the North Dakota

State Water Commission Governing Water Use Fees Adopted Pursuant to Section 61-02-14 of the North Dakota Century Code for discussion.

Mr. Sagsveen noted that these regulations were first drafted in November, 1975, and have been modified once. Under the new statutes, the form would have to be changed. There is statutory authority for the State Engineer to levy water use fees for water permits.

Mr. Sagsveen stated that all of the industrial water permits that have been issued since 1974 contain specific conditions that the industrial water users shall pay fees as assessed by the State Water Commission.

He also noted that a \$20 figure was used when this draft was prepared which was in the Bureau of Reclamation's contract they had prepared and this figure was only used for sake of illustration.

Secretary Fahy noted that two types of proposals are being considered: 1) a conditional charge or optional charge of \$2.00 per acre-foot of water; and 2) a perfected use charge of \$20.00 per acre-foot of water per year.

Secretary Fahy reviewed a proposal submitted previously by Representative Maixner of New England, North Dakota, which is attached to these minutes as APPENDIX "E". Representative Maixner then explained his basis for the proposal.

Secretary Fahy suggested that he and his staff could prepare some projections of examples for further consideration by the Commission if it is agreed that an option charge is needed.

Commissioner Gallagher said he felt there should be an option charge and \$2.00 per acre-foot of water meets with his approval; should treat under separate schedule the irrigation waters; industrial water users should be charged for both surface and ground waters; and for industrial water users there should be no free use - begin charging with the first acre-foot.

Commissioner Kramer suggested that the State Water Commission prepare examples for all existing industrial plants using a \$2.00 per acre-foot option charge annually; prepare examples of existing users beginning with the first acre-foot and first gallon of water; and also prepare another example showing an exemption up to 5000 acre-feet of water.

Commissioner Wilhelm agreed with Commissioner Kramer's suggestion, and in addition she suggested that a graduated-charge scale also be prepared.

It was the consensus of the Commission members that the State Engineer be directed to prepare examples of projections from the suggestions as discussed and present at the next Water Commission meeting for further discussion and consideration.

OTHER BUSINESS

Under other business, Secretary Fahy updated the Commission members on the dam safety program, discussed the status of the Pembilier Dam; discussed the recommendations submitted by the Booz-Allen & Hamilton Consulting firm on the Legislative Council's performance audit of the State Water Commission; reported on the meeting held with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Indian Affairs Commission; and discussed the current status of the Rush Lake project.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Title 84: State Water Commission and State Engineer

Article 84-05: The Use of Water for Irrigation Purposes

Action: Proposed Rules and Regulations (First Draft, dated
(2/28/78)

Summary: The State Water Commission is considering regulations which would, if adopted, establish residency requirements for water permit applicants and permittees, establish age requirements for water permit applicants and permittees, establish limitations on the water permit application by persons during a three year time period, establish limitations on undeveloped permits by a water permit applicant and permittee, and establish maximum authorized irrigable acreage by a permittee.

Hearings: It is the policy of the State Water Commission to afford the public an opportunity to participate in the development of the proposed regulations. Accordingly, interested persons may submit written comments, suggestions, or objections regarding the proposed regulations to the State Water Commission. Public hearings on the proposed regulations are anticipated. Comments should be submitted to the State Engineer, State Water Commission, State Office Building, 900 East Boulevard, Bismarck, N.D. 58505.

Effective date of proposed regulations: The proposed regulations are still in the developmental state. Therefore, the State Water Commission has not yet determined whether the proposed regulations will be adopted or, if adopted, when

they will be effective.

Supplemental information: The concepts contained in the proposed regulations have been provided by members of the State Water Commission. They do not constitute opinions or suggestions by the author. The proposed regulations have been drafted by Assistant Attorney General Murray G. Sagsveen, (701) 224-2750.

Authority: These regulations are adopted pursuant to general regulation-making authority of the state water commission and the state engineer in North Dakota Century Code sections 61-02-11 and 61-03-13.

The authority for the state water commission and the state engineer to adopt regulations limiting the area of land which may be irrigated and requiring the landowner to reside on or in the neighborhood of the land irrigated is implied in the following sections of the North Dakota Century Code:

61-02-01. WATER CONSERVATION, FLOOD CONTROL, AND ABATEMENT OF STREAM POLLUTION DECLARED A PUBLIC PURPOSE. -- It is hereby declared that the general welfare and the protection of the lives, health, property, and the rights of all the people of this state require that the conservation and control of waters in this state, public or private, navigable or unnavigable, surface or subsurface, the control of floods, and the regulation and prevention of water pollution, involve and necessitate the exercise of the sovereign powers of this state and are affected with and concern a public purpose. It is declared further that any and all exercise of sovereign powers of this state in investigating, constructing, maintaining, regulating, supervising, and controlling any system of works involving such subject matter embraces and concerns a single object, and that the state water conservation commission in the exercise of its powers, and in the performance of all its official duties, shall be considered and construed

to be performing a governmental function for the benefit, welfare, and prosperity of all the people of this state.

61-02-14. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION. -The commission shall have full and complete power,
authority, and general jurisdiction:

- 1. To investiage, plan, regulate, undertake, construct, establish, maintain, control, operate, and supervise all works, dams, and projects, public and private, which in its judgment may be necessary or advisable.
 - k. To provide for the storage, development, diversion, delivery, and distribution of water for the irrigation of agricultural land and supply water for municipal and industrial purposes....
- To define, declare, and establish rules and regulations:
 - b. For the full and complete supervision, regulation, and control of the water supplies within the state....
- 5. To exercise all express and implied rights, power and authority, that may be necessary, and to do, perform, and carry out all of the expressed purposes of this chapter and all of the purposes reasonably implied incidentally thereto or lawfully connected therewith;

61-02-29. COMMISSION TO HAVE FULL CONTROL OVER UNAPPROPRIATED PUBLIC WATERS OF THE STATE. -The commission shall have full control over all unappropriated public waters of the state, whether above or under the ground, to the extent necessary to fulfill the purposes of this chapter.

- Principal place of residence within a fifty mile radius of the land to receive or receiving water at least ten months per year and who receives a majority of his total gross income from farming, ranching, and other agricultural activities.

- 1. However, a husband and wife may together hold permits to irrigate up to nine hundred sixty acres of irrigable land notwithstanding the extent of their individual ownerships.
- 2. If a permittee is a legal entity other than a single ownership, the permitted irrigable acreage shall be prorated in proportion to the ownership interest.

For example, if a person has a one-third interest in a partnership holding a permit to irrigate four hundred eighty acres of irrigable land, one hundred sixty acres shall be prorated to that person.

3. A permittee who involuntarily acquires permitted irrigable acreage in excess of the limits authorized in this section (e.g. by inheritance or death of a spouse) shall have five years to transfer such property before the initiation of forfeiture proceedings by the state engineer.

ON THE RED RIVER OF THE NORTH
AND THE BOIS DE SIOUX RIVER

- 1. Article IV of the agreement is hereby amended by the deletion of the existing article and the insertion of the following new article:
 - IV. JOINT DIKE CRITERIA FOR AGRICULTURAL DIKE CONSTRUCTION

A. GENERAL PURPOSE

The purpose of these criteria is to provide for the orderly and consistent review of permit applications to construct, relocate, rebuild or alter agricultural dikes along the Red River of the North and Bois de Sioux Rivers in order to assure that the granting of such permits would be in the best interests of the people of Minnesota and North Dakota. These criteria would be mutually applicable in both states. The authority to establish these joint criteria is granted to the Commissioner of Natural Resources in Minnesota Statutes, Sections 105.42, 105.49 and 471.59 and to the North Dakota State Water Commission by Sections 61-02-24 and 61-16-15 of the North Dakota Century Code. The two states recognize that establishment of these criteria governing the issuance, review and denial of permits to construct, relocate, rebuild or alter agricultural dikes along the boundary rivers is but the <u>first</u> step in the exercise of joint control over those activities which could contribute to an increased flood potential of these rivers. The two states further recognize the need to exercise this joint control in that water management decisions which appear logical in a local or statewide context may have negative interstate and international impacts.

The criteria herein are being established at this time because there is a current need to provide a basis for the review of existing, unauthorized agricultural dikes and permit applications for the construction of additional agricultural dikes along the boundary waters. Local land owners view such dikes as interim solutions to local flood problems.

B. JURISDICTION

These criteria governing the review, issuance and denial of permits to construct, relocate, rebuild or alter agricultural dikes along the boundary rivers pertain to all such dikes located within the flood plains of the Red River of the North and the Bois de Sioux Rivers. Floodplain areas of the Red River of the North are defined by Appendix O, Volume 8 of the Souris-Red-Rainy Basins Comprehensive Study as "Red River of the North Main Stem Regional Floodplain Area" and the floodplain of the Bois de Sioux River is defined by the U.S. Geological Survey one percent chance of recurrence area flood quadrangles. These criteria apply to dikes constructed on tributaries within the floodplains of these boundary rivers.

C. DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of these regulations certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted as follows:

"Agricultural Dike" or "Dike" means an embankment constructed of earth and/or other suitable materials to protect agricultural lands from frequently recurring floods (10-year frequency or more often) which result from overflow of watercourses or from diffused surface waters.

"Boundary Rivers" means the Red River of the North and the Bois de Sioux River as they form a natural boundary between the States of Minnesota and North Dakota.

"Farmstead" means a farm dwelling, adjacent farm buildings and those nontillable acres adjacent to the buildings.

"Flood Frequency" means the average frequency, statistically determined, for which it is expected that a specific flood stage or discharge may be equalled or exceeded. This frequency is usually expressed as having a probability of occurring, on the average, once within a specified number of years.

"Flood Waters" means those waters which temporarily inundate normally dry areas adjoining a watercouse. This inundation results from an overflow of the watercourse caused by excessive amounts of rainfall and/or snowmelt which exceed its capacity.

"Ring Dike" means an embankment constructed of earth and/or other suitable materials which completely encloses a parcel of land.

"Watercourse" means a channel in which a flow of water occurs either continuously or intermittently in a definite direction. The term applies to either natural or artificially constructed channels.

"Watercourse, Class I" means, in Minnesota, those natural watercourses serving as major drainage outlets, or major tributaries to those outlets, which are capable of serving a number of beneficial public purposes; smaller natural watercourses serving specific values such as trout streams and scenic waterways.

"Watercourse, Class II" means, in Minnesota, those natural watercourses serving as tributaries of Class I watercourses which are often perennial streams serving more than one beneficial public purpose.

D. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of these regulations shall be severable, and the invalidity of any paragraph, subparagraph, or subdivision thereof shall not make void any other paragraph, subparagraph, subdivision, or any other part.

E. DESIGN CRITERIA

- 1. Dike Setbacks. Dikes are to be constructed a sufficient distance from the river so as not to cause an increase in the elevation of flood water of the 10-year frequency flood of more than one (1) foot at any point along the river. However, when the effect of the dike extends within the corporate limits of any city the permitted increase in flood water elevation shall not exceed 0.5 feet within the corporate limits of the city. Calculation of the effects of proposed dikes shall be based on the dikes being located on both sides of the boundary water an equal distance from the center of the channel. If mutual agreement has been reached between applicants on both sides of the river as to location of the dike, the "equal distance from the center" requirements may be waived providing the limit for increase in flood stage is met.
- 2. <u>Dike Elevations</u>. Dikes are to be designed and constructed so that they will be overtopped upon the occurrence of a flood that is one foot higher than the 10-year frequency flood at that point.
- 3. <u>Dike Dimensions</u>. Dike top width shall not be less than six (6) feet. Side slopes shall not be steeper than 3:1, except where slope stability analysis and slope erosion control can justify steeper slopes. No organic soil or material shall be allowed in the foundation of the fill of dikes.

- 4. <u>Vegetative Cover and Riprap</u>. A protective cover of grasses shall be established on all exposed surfaces of the dike. Riprap shall be used where required for control of erosion.
- 5. <u>Interior Drainage</u>. Dikes shall have provisions for interior drainage.

 The design shall include plans to handle the discharge from the drainage area based on drainage design requirements for the local area.

F. HYDROLOGIC DATA FOR DESIGN

The North Dakota State Water Commission and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources shall provide the discharges and corresponding elevations of the 10-year flood (and other available flood data), in relation to known historic floods, for use in dike design.

G. DIKES ACROSS NATURAL WATERWAYS AND LEGAL DRAINS

Dikes shall not be constructed across Class I or Class II watercourses in Minnesota. Dikes shall not be constructed across the following rivers in North Dakota: Wild Rice, Sheyenne, Elm, Goose, Turtle, Forest, Park and Pembina. Dikes constructed across other natural waterways, streams or rivers in Minnesota and North Dakota shall have an opening capable of passing the summer storm having a four percent chance of recurrence and have an emergency spillway to prevent overtopping of the structure when the one percent (1%) summer storm occurs. Dike setbacks along tributary waterways, within the area defined in Section B of these criteria, to the boundary water shall meet the criteria as stated in Section E.

Dikes constructed across legal drains or public ditch systems shall require the approval of the appropriate watershed district, drain board, water management district or other local authority.

H. FARMSTEAD DIKING

Within an existing dike system, ring dikes around individual farmsteads shall not require dike permits if they are not provided with tie-backs to existing roadways

or dikes. Ring dikes provided with tie-backs shall be considered part of the overall dike system and will be required to secure diking permits. Outside the dike system there shall be no limitations on tie-backs of dikes around farmsteads.

I. ADMINISTRATION

- 1. Application for Permit. All applications submitted by the owner to construct, to relocate, rebuild or alter dikes shall be made on forms provided by the Minnesota DNR or ND State Water Commission and shall be accompanied by two (2) complete sets of plans or specifications. Such plans and specifications shall include the following:
 - A) A general location map with a minimum scale of 1"=800' showing the following:
 - 1) Location of the dike with respect to the watercourse
 - 2) Location of field inlets to provide for internal drainage
 - 3) Location of legal drains and natural channels tributary to the main river channel.
- B) Detailed cross-sections of the dike showing elevations, in relation to mean sea level, and side slopes.

After review of the information required above and other available data, the state agency to which the application is made shall determine the location and number of required cross-sections of the river channel and overland areas. These locations shall be provided to the applicant who shall then provide the required cross-section data. The applicant shall undertake and agree to pay the expenses incurred in securing these cross-sections.

2. Joint Permit Applications. Joint permit applications involving two or more landowners or a permit application on behalf of two or more landowners will be accepted by the State agencies. These permit applications, taken together, must meet the above criteria.

- 3. <u>Issuance of Permits</u>. Dike permits will be issued only upon concurrent approval by the state and local government in which state the dikes are located. Approval of the permit will in no way relieve the owner from damages which may be caused or created by construction of the dikes.
- 4. <u>Joint Administration</u>. A copy of each application for a permit shall be forwarded by the state agency receiving the initial application to the other state for comment and recommendation before final approval is granted.
- 5. Permit Revocation. The applicant shall provide for certification by a registered land surveyor, engineer, or other qualified person or agency that the finished dike elevations are not higher than those approved by the state agency to which the application was submitted. The permit will be revoked for failure to provide this certification.

The permit may be revoked for failure to construct the dike in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted. Structural alteration of the dike without permission of the appropriate state agency will also result in having the permit revoked.

6. <u>Dike Maintenance</u>. All dikes must be adequately maintained to the required shape, height, and protective covering. All maintenance shall be the responsibility of the permit holder. The maintenance of dikes must include periodic removal of woody vegetation (for example, trees and shrubs) which may become established on the embankment. Design of the project shall include provisions of maintenance access.

J. EXCEPTION TO THE CRITERIA

Under special circumstances, exceptions to the dike criteria may be authorized on an individual basis but they must have the concurrent approval of the N.D. State Engineer, local water management board in North Dakota, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and local watershed district in Minnesota. Factors that will be considered shall be increase in flood stage, increase of stage at existing city dike, increase in stream velocity and environmental effects. Request for exceptions must

be accompanied by a plan satisfactory to all agencies.

K. APPLICATION TO EXISTING DIKES

These criteria shall apply to all unauthorized dikes constructed in the past for the protection of those agricultural lands located within the floodplains of the Red River of the North and the Bois de Sioux, as defined in Section B of these criteria. Exceptions are farmstead dikes if they meet the provision of Section H of these criteria.

2. The first paragraph of Article V of the agreement is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "adopted pursuant to" and the insertion in lieu thereof the words "contained in". The first paragraph of Article V, as amended, therefore provides:

V. REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORIZED DIKES

Parties to this agreement hereby agree that they shall immediately take whatever steps are necessary and available to remove unauthorized dikes adjacent to the boundary rivers not meeting the criteria contained in part IV above.

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HEARING DATES SET FOR APRIL 25-26 ON PROPOSED CRITERIA FOR AGRICULTURAL DIKE CONSTRUCTION ALONG RED RIVER OF THE NORTH

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and the North Dakota State Water Commission have announced they have developed proposed joint criteria to provide for the review of permit applications to construct, relocate, rebuild or alter agricultural dikes along the Red River of the North and the Bois de Sioux River. The criteria would be mutually applicable in both states. North Dakota and Minnesota signed a cooperative agreement on November 23, 1976, to establish joint criteria for dike construction along the boundary waters. The proposed criteria were developed after several meetings with the Minnesota - Dakota Farmers Flood Control Association. That Association represents farmers in the Oslo, Minnesota, and adjacent North Dakota areas who built flood protection dikes in 1975 without required state permits. The proposed criteria would apply to all unauthorized dikes constructed in the past.

In developing the criteria, North Dakota and Minnesota requested the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to prepare a report on known flood data and to summarize results of the Corps analysis of the effects of existing dike construction. The Corps study report was transmitted to two states and the Minnesota - Dakota Farmers Flood Control Association last November. The public may review the report at local watershed district, drainage board, or water management district offices; at governmental offices in cities and counties along the boundary waters; and at the regional office of the Upper Mississippi River Basin Commission in Fargo.

In his letter transmitting the Corps study, District Engineer Colonel Forrest T. Gay, stated his concern over the potential adverse impacts which could occur to the river regime should indiscriminate

construction of farm levees continue unabated or uncontrolled. He went on to say that "Such farm levees, if built high enough and close enough to the river banks, would cause significant increases in flood stages and flood velocities for all discharges in excess of bank-full capacity."

Hearings on the proposed criteria will be held on April 25, 1978, at Moorhead State University, in the Ballroom of the Comstock Memorial Union Building, 6th Avenue and 14th Street South, Moorhead, and on April 26, 1978, in A&B Room 36 of the Grand Forks Armory Auditorium, 615 1st Avenue North, Grand Forks. The hearings will commence each day at 9:30 a.m. and continue until all who wish to be heard on the proposed criteria have had the opportunity to be heard.

North Dakota and Minnesota have expressed the hope that the hearings on the proposed criteria will be well attended and that the audience will be a cross-representation of all interests, in order to reflect total public attitude toward the proposed criteria. They believe that the final adopted criteria will be more meaningful if there is an informed public and maximum public input to the decision-making process. All those who attend the hearing in either Moorhead or Grand Forks will be given the opportunity to be heard, if they so desire. It will not be necessary for the public to attend both hearings for their comments to be considered. The proposed criteria will be presented and testimony taken at each hearing location.


