### MINUTES

### North Dakota State Water Commission Meeting Held In Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Headquarters Carrington, North Dakota

#### July 19, 1978

The North Dakota State Water Commission held a meeting on July 19, 1978, in the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Headquarters, Carrington, North Dakota. Governor-Chairman, Arthur A. Link, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to present the agenda.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES FOR JUNE 23, 1978, MEETING -	Secretary Fahy briefly reviewed the minutes of the June 23, 1978, meeting.
APPROVED	There was no discussion by the Commission
	members on the minutes.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that the minutes of the June 23, 1978 meeting be approved as prepared and distributed.

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CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES FOR JUNE 1, 1978, MEETING -CORRECTION

Secretary Fahy noted a correction for the minutes of the June 1, 1978, meeting. During the meeting he had incorrectly stated that McKenzie

County was the last county to undertake a groundwater study. Towner County has not yet entered a contract with the State Water Commission for a ground water study; however, an agreement is presently being negotiated. (Note: This paragraph was amended at August 23, 1978 meeting-page 167)

REQUEST FROM CITY OF GRAND FORKS FOR COST PARTICIPATION FOR REPAIR OF RIVERSIDE PARK DAM (SWC Project No. 520)

Secretary Fahy and David Sprynczynatyk reviewed the problems with the Grand Forks Riverside Park Dam, which forms the municipal water supply pumping pool for Grand Forks. The dam requires temporary repairs which could last up

to ten years. The dam is being investigated for the city to determine the engineering and feasibility of a new dam. The City of Grand Forks had requested assistance for the costs associated with the temporary repairs. Secretary Fahy recommended cost participation of 50% of the estimated repair cost of \$115,000, not to exceed \$57,500.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Gallagher that the State Water Commission participate in the temporary repair of Riverside Park Dam for 50% of the repair costs, not to exceed \$57,500. Motion unanimously approved.

REQUEST FROM STEELE COUNTY FOR COST PARTICIPATION ON NELSON~STEELE DRAIN NO. 7A (SWC Project No. 1622)

Secretary Fahy and David Sprynczynatyk reviewed the proposed Nelson-Steele Drain No. 7A with the Commission. Secretary Fahy explained that the drain has been designed so that two

natural low lying areas are used as retention reservoirs, thereby reducing the discharge from the area compared to existing conditions.

Secretary Fahy further noted that the total cost of the project is estimated at \$247,900. Using present cost participation criteria, the Commission share would be \$90,540. However, the contract fund has only \$30,000 uncommitted at this time.

Secretary Fahy recommended cost participation for 40% of the drain project, not to exceed \$90,540. \$30,000 would be available for this biennium plus whatever other remaining funds may be available from the contract fund at the end of the biennium. The remaining funds would be available next biennium, subject to the availability of appropriations.

Chairman Link and Commissioner Just expressed concern that this drainage project may contribute to further

flood problems in the Red River. Secretary Fahy explained that the project had been carefully designed to reduce peak flows into the Red River, thereby reducing the flood hazard potential.

It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Kramer, that the State Water Commission participate in the construction of Nelson-Steele Drain No. 7A for 40% of the eligible construction costs, not to exceed \$90,540. Further, that only \$30,000 (and any remaining balance in the contract fund) would be available this biennium with the remaining funds to be available next biennium, subject to the availability of appropriations. The motion was unanimously approved.

REQUEST FROM CASS COUNTY FOR COST PARTICIPATION ON CASS COUNTY DRAINS NO. 37 & 39.	Secretary Fahy and David Sprynczynatyk reviewed the continued construction of Cass County Drains No. 37 & 39. These drains have been constructed in phases, and the Commission has funded previous
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phases of the drains.

The total cost of completing drain No. 37 is \$46,000, of which the Commission has already committed \$3,908; the request is for an additional \$12,892. The cost of completion of drain No. 39 is \$60,500 of which the Commission has committed \$6,290 towards completion; the request is for an additional \$15,710.

Secretary Fahy recommended cost participation for 40% of eligibile items for completion of Cass County Drains No. 37 & 39, not to exceed \$12,892 and \$15,710 respectively.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Kramer, that the State Water Commission participate in the completion of Cass County Drains No. 37 & 39 for 40% of the eligible construction costs, not to exceed \$12,892 and \$15,710 respectively. The motion was carried unanimously.

PROGRESS REPORT OF SOUTHWEST NORTH DAKOTA WATER DELIVERY STUDY

Secretary Fahy introduced Hank Trangsrud, Houston Engineering, Fargo, ND, the consulting engineer for the project.

Mr. Trangsrud explained that this firm, Commission staff and the advisory committee is exploring several alternatives for delivery of water to southwest North Dakota. Later, a number of the alternatives will be reduced. Basic considerations for selection of primary alternatives will be such factors as elevation, distance, amount of water requested, and number of individuals to be served.

Mr. Trangsrud reviewed a municipal questionnaire summary and a rural area survey (attached as APPENDIX "A" & "B").

He noted that there have been two meetings with the advisory committee. During the meetings criteria for evaluating the criteria have been developed. The criteria are:

- 1. number of users
- 2. ability to relieve critical needs
- 3. cost
- 4. energy consumption
- 5. environmental considerations
- 6. financing ability
- 7. compatibility with area goals
- 8. feasibility of implementation
- 9. system reliability
- 10. public acceptance

Mr. Trangsrud explained that all interested parties are in the process of prioritizing the criteria.

The next meeting of the advisory committee will be August 17, 1978. An attempt will be made at that time to reduce the number of alternatives. The first draft of the study report will then be prepared for possible distribution by November 1. The final draft is expected by December 1.

In a response to a question from Chairman Link, Mr. Trangsrud advised that any system would be designed to accomodate limited expansion provided the expansion is not in concentrated areas.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION ONA third draft of the regulations wasACREAGE LIMITATIONSintroduced. This draft was based upon(SWC Project No. 1400)recommendations made by Mr. Spiry at the<br/>June 23, 1978, meeting. The draft wasbriefly explained by Assistant Attorney General Sagsveen. The draft is attached<br/>as APPENDIX "C".

It was the consensus of the Commission that all three drafts be consolidated into a single document by the July 28 meeting for consideration at the August meeting.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION ON WATER MARKETING

CONSIDERATION OF WATER PERMIT REQUESTS (SWC Project No. 1400) It was the consensus of the Commission that this agenda item be postponed until the August meeting.

Secretary Fahy presented APPENDIX "D", the water permit agenda, for the Commission's consideration.

After a brief discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelm, that the action of the State Engineer be confirmed as presented. Motion unanimously approved.

DISCUSSION OF SUPREME DECISIONS Assistant Attorney General Sagsveen advised the Commission of recent Supreme Court decisions concerning water.

United States v. New Mexico concerned reserved water rights. The Court held that the United States, in setting the Gila National Forest aside from other public lands reserved the use of water out of the Rio Mimbres River only where necessary to preserve the timber in the forest or to secure favorable water flows, and hence not to have a reserved right for aesthetic, recreational, wildlife, preservation, and stockwatering purposes.

<u>California</u> v. <u>United States</u> concerned Section 8 of the Reclamation Act of 1902. The Bureau of Reclamation applied to the California State Water Resources Control Board for a permit to appropriate water that would be impounded by the New Melones Dam. The Board attached 25 conditions to the water permit. The Court held that a state may impose any condition on "control, appropriation, use or distribution of water" in a federal reclamation project that is not inconsistent with clear congressional directives respecting the project.

There being no further business to come before the Commission at this time -

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher and seconded by Commissioner Kramer that the meeting adjourn at 4:00 p.m. The motion was unanimously approved.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

Title 89: State Water Commission and State Engineer Article 89-03: Water Appropriations

<u>Chapter 89-03-03</u>: Procedures Concerning Water Permit Applications for Irrigation Purposes.

Action: Proposed Rules and Regulations. This is the third draft dated 7/19/78; the first draft was dated 2/28/78; the second draft was dated 6/2/78.

<u>Summary</u>: The State Engineer is considering regulations which would, if adopted, establish limitations and procedural requirements on certain water permit applications for irrigation purposes.

Hearings: It is the policy of the State Water Commission and State Engineer to afford the public an opportunity to participate in the development of the proposed regulations. Accordingly, interested persons may submit written comments, suggestions, or objections regarding the proposed regulations. Public hearings have been held. Comments may be submitted to the State Engineer, State Water Commission, State Office Building, 900 East Boulevard, Bismarck, N.D. 58505. Effective date of proposed regulations: The proposed regulations are still in the developmental state. Therefore, the State Water Commission and State Engineer have not yet determined whether the proposed regulations should be adopted or, if adopted, when they should be effective.

Supplemental Information: The concepts contained in the

proposed regulations have been provided by members of the State Water Commission and by Mr. Lynnard K. Spiry, Sr. at the June  $\overset{23}{\times}$  1978, meeting of the State Water Commission. They do not constitute opinions or suggestions by the individual drafting the regulations, Assistant Attorney General Murray G. Sagsveen.

<u>Authority</u>: The proposed regulations are considered for adoption pursuant to general regulation-making authority of the state engineer in North Dakota Century Code Sections 61-03-13 and 61-04-03:

> 61-03-13. RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY STATE ENGINEER--MODIFICATION.--The state engineer shall make all general rules and regulations necessary to carry into effect the duties devolving upon his office, and may change the same from time to time in his discretion. All such rules and regulations relating to applications for permits to appropriate water, for the inspection of works, for the issuance of licenses, and for the determination of rights to the use of water, shall be modified by the state engineer, if required by a vote of the state water conservation commission.

61-04-03. APPLICATION FOR WATER PERMIT--CONTENTS--INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY.--The application for a permit to make beneficial use of any waters of the state shall be in the form required by the rules and regulations established by the state engineer. Such rules and regulations shall prescribe the form and contents of, and the procedure for filing, the application. The application, along with all other information filed with it, shall be retained in the office of the commission after approval or disapproval of the application. The state engineer may require additional information not provided for in the general rules and regulations if he deems it to be necessary. 89-03-03-01. INTENT. The limitations and procedural requirements for certain water permit applications for irrigation purposes contained in this chapter are designed:

- 1. To provide opportunity for a maximum number of farmers on the land.
- 2. To widely distribute the benefits which accrue from utilizing waters of the state.
- 3. To promote the family-size owner-operated farm.

89-03-03-02. APPLICATION. The policies contained in this article shall apply to water permits granted after the effective date of the chapter.

89-03-03-03. DEFINITIONS. Unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions apply to this chapter:

- "State engineer" means the state engineer, appointed pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 61-03-01, who is also the chief engineer and secretary of the commission.
- 2. "Application" means an application for a conditional water permit for irrigation purposes.
- 3. "Applicant" means a person submitting an application for a conditional water permit for irrigation purposes.
- 4. "Irrigable land" means the area to which acreage limitations are applicable and is the net acreage possessing irrigated crop production potential, after excluding areas that are occupied by and currently used for homesites, farmstead buildings, and corollary permanent structures such as feed lots, equipment storage yards, and similar facilities, together with dedicated roads open for general unrestricted use by the public. Areas used for field roads, farm ditches and drains, tail water ponds, temporary equipment storage, and other uses dependent on operational requirements necessary to produce a specific crop, and subject to change at will, are included in the net irrigable acreage. "Resident owner" means a landowner who has his 5. principal place of residence within the State of

North Dakota or within 25 miles of the state's boundary.

89-03-03-04. APPLICANT CRITERIA. All applicants must meet the criteria contained in this chapter.

89-03-03-05. REJECTION OF UNACCEPTABLE APPLICATIONS. The state engineer shall not accept an application unless the applicant meets the criteria contained in this chapter. Therefore, an application will not be assigned a priority date pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 61-04-04 unless it is filed in compliance with this chapter.

89-03-03-06. RESIDENCY. An applicant must be a resident owner.

89-03-03-07. LEGAL AGE. An applicant must be eighteen years of age.

89-03-03-08. TIME LIMITATIONS CONCERNING INITIAL WATER PERMIT APPLICATIONS. An applicant may not, during any thirty-six month period, apply for water permits to irrigate more than applicant's first three hundred and twenty acres of irrigable land. Examples:

 Mr. Irrigator files water permit applications with the state engineer on August 1, 1979; he has not filed previous applications nor does he hold any water permits for irrigation purposes. The applications request water to irrigate three hundred twenty acres of irrigable land. Mr. Irrigator may not file additional water permit applications until August 1, 1982.

Miss Waterspreader files a water permit application 2 with the state engineer on August 1, 1979; she has not filed previous applications nor does she hold any water permits for irrigation purposes. The application requests water to irrigate one hundred sixty acres of irrigable land. A second application for one hundred sixty acres is filed on September 1, 1980. Miss Waterspreader will be eligible to file additional permit applications to irrigate up to one hundred sixty acres of irrigable land on August 1, 1982. If no additional applications are filed by September 1, 1983, Miss Waterspreader may file water permit applications for the irrigation of up to three hundred twenty more acres of irrigable land.

89-03-03-09. DEVELOPMENT OF PERMITS PRIOR TO FILING APPLICATION. A person who holds an undeveloped permit or permits to irrigate one hundred sixty acres or more of irrigable land may not submit an application.

89-03-03-10. APPLICATION PROCEDURE IF APPLICANT HOLDS PERMITS TO IRRIGATE MORE THAN 200 ACRES OF IRRIGABLE LAND. If an applicant holds permits to irrigate more than two hundred acres of irrigable land, the following procedure must be followed prior to submission of an application:

- 1. Applicant shall send a notice of intent to apply by certified mail to the following:
  - a. Each city located within a one mile (1.6 kilometer) radius of the proposed water appropriation site.
  - b. Each record title owner of real estate within a one mile (1.6 kilometer) radius of the proposed water appropriation site (excluding all landowners within the geographical boundary of a city). Within fifteen days of mailing of notice to landowners, record title ownership shall be established through records in the appropriate register of deeds office, treasurers office, or abstract office. Record title owners of land under a contract

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for deed shall include both the grantor and grantee of the contract for deed.

- 2. After the notice of intent to apply has been mailed to those required by this section, the applicant shall complete an affidavit of mailing which shall accompany the application when it is filed with the state engineer.
- 3. The application may not be filed with the state engineer until sixty days after all appropriate parties (identified in paragraph 1, above) have actually received the notice of intent to apply.
- 4. For purposes of clarification, illustrated examples involving the one mile (1.6 kilometer) radius from the location of the proposed water appropriation site are attached in "Appendix A" as the final page of Article 89-03.
- 5. The affidavit of mailing shall conform substantially to the following format (a form affidavit shall be supplied to applicant upon request):

I hereby certify that I have sent, by certified mail, a notice of intent to apply for a conditional water permit for irrigation purposes to:

- a. each city located within a radius of one mile from the location of the proposed appropriation site; and
- b. each record title owner of real estate within a radius of one mile from the location of the proposed water appropriation site (excluding all landowners within the geographical boundary of a city).

The record title owners were determined by an actual search of the records in the appropriate register of deeds office or abstract office within fifteen days of the mailing of the notice to landowners. A notice was sent to both the grantor and grantee of land under a contract for deed.

6. The notice of intent to apply for a conditional water permit for irrigation purposes shall conform substantially to the following format (a form notice shall be supplied to applicant by the state engineer upon request):

NOTICE OF INTENT TO APPLY FOR A CONDITIONAL WATER PERMIT FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES

TAKE NOTICE THAT ( name and address of applicant) intends to apply to the state engineer for a conditional water permit for irrigation purposes. The application will request a permit to appropriate water from (specify "groundwater" or name of stream)

The application will request a permit to appropriate water from a point or point on the lands described as follows: (specify legal description) with an average approximate rate of withdrawal at (specify gallons per minute) during the operating season for each year with an annual appropriation of acre-feet.

The application will be filed with the State Engineer sixty days after all landowners or cities within a one mile radius of the appropriation site specified above have been notified by certified mail. During that period, you may (if authorized by state law or regulations of the State Engineer) file an application for a conditional water permit thereby establishing an early priority day.

Upon the filing of the application, you will be notified of the time and date for a hearing upon the application.

## 89-03-03-11. ACREAGE LIMITATIONS.

- 1. A person may not submit an application which, if approved, would authorize the irrigation of more than four hundred eighty acres of irrigable land.
- 2. However, a husband and wife may together apply for permits to irrigate up to nine hundred sixty acres of irrigable land notwithstanding the extent of their individual ownerships.
- 3. If an applicant is a legal entity other than a single ownership (e.g. partnership, cooperative, trust), the permitted irrigable acreage shall be prorated in proportion to the beneficial or legal ownership interest. For example, if a person has a one-third interest in a partnership holding a permit to irrigate four hundred eighty acres of irrigable land, one hundred sixty acres shall be prorated to that person. If that person also has a 10% beneficial interest in a trust comprised of a permit to irrigate 2000 acres of irrigable land, 200 acres shall also be prorated to that person. The person, therefore, would be authorized to irrigate an additional 120 acres under these regulations.
