MINUTES

North Dakota State Water Commission Meeting Held In Bismarck, North Dakota

December 2, 1980

The North Dakota State Water Commission held a meeting on December 2, 1980, at the Holiday Inn in Bismarck, North Dakota. Governor-Chairman, Arthur A. Link, called the meeting to order at 4:15 p.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to present the agenda.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Arthur A. Link, Governor-Chairman Richard Gallagher, Vice Chairman, Mandan Alvin Kramer, Member from Minot Arthur Lanz, Member from Devils Lake Myron Just, Commissioner, Department of Agriculture, Bismarck Vernon Fahy, State Engineer and Secretary, North Dakota State Water Commission, Bismarck

MEMBERS ABSENT: Gordon Gray, Member from Valley City Arlene Wilhelm, Member from Dickinson

OTHERS PRESENT: State Water Commission Staff Members Approximately 25 persons interested in agenda items

The proceedings of the meeting were recorded to assist in compilation of the minutes.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 18 AND 19, 1980 MEETING - APPROVED	Secretary Fahy reviewed the minutes of the November 18 and 19, 1980 meeting held in Bismarck, North Dakota, and updated the Commission members on various items. There were no corrections or additions to the minutes.

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Kramer, and unanimously carried, that the minutes of the November 18 and 19, 1980 meeting be approved as presented.

RECOMMENDATION OF JOINTSecretary Fahy indicated that at the lastRED RIVER WATER MANAGEMENTmeeting of the Commission during whichBOARDS CONCERNING SHEYENNEthe Corps of Engineers made a presentationRIVER FLOOD CONTROLrelative to the Sheyenne River Flood(SWC Project No. 1344)Control project, it was decided to request
the Joint Red River Water Management

Boards to file a recommendation after they had heard the same Corps presentation. The joint boards will present their report at this meeting of the Commission.

Mr. Robert Thompson, Chairman of the Joint Red River Water Management Board, was introduced. Mr. Thompson indicated that the Boards met, and wished to flle the following recommendation with the Commission:

"Leander Wawers, Richland County Water Management Board, made a motion to support continued studying of Plan D-1 or Plan D-2 of the Sheyenne River Study conducted by the Corps of Engineers with the requirement of small upland water retention dams being part of the final plan. The motion was seconded by Maynard Lien, Sargent County Water Management Board. The motion carried.

After discussion, it was the consensus of the Commission members that a request be made to the Corps of Engineers to also study a combination of alternatives D-1 and D-2 in which small upland water retention dams would be included. Prior to making a final decision on the alternatives, a hearing will be held in the local area.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Just, and unanimously carried, that a copy of the motion adopted by the Red River Joint Water Management Boards be forwarded to the Corps of Engineers requesting them to include in their continued study of alternatives D-1, D-2 and K-3, a combination of alternatives D-1 and D-2 which would include the requirement of small upland water retention dams.

CONSIDERATION OF WATER PERMIT REQUESTS (SWC Project No. 1400)

Secretary Fahy presented the water permit agenda, labeled as APPENDIX "A", for the Commission's consideration.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Just, and unanimously carried, that the actions of the State Engineer be confirmed. (SEE APPENDIX ''A'')

The following water permit requests were approved, subject to conditions as stated on each individual permit: No. 3309 - Roy Adolf, Beulah; No. 3318 - Amoco Production Company, Dickinson; No. 3250 - Edwin L. Oster, Hazen; No. 3271 - City of Ross; No. 3273 - Duane Walz, Beulah; No. 3263 - James R. Britton, Fargo; No. 3274 - Tony Belohlavek, Mandan; No. 3287 - The Western Company of North America, Fort Worth, Texas; and No. 3230 -Joe Loh, Manning.

The following water permit applications were deferred: No. 3304 - City of Dazey; Nos. 3315, 3316 and 3317 - Amoco Production Company, Dickinson; and No. 3306 - Ronnie Berry, Cartwright.

REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE FROM OAK CREEK WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT IN CLEANOUT OF LAKE METIGOSHE (SWC Project No. 330) Mr. Glen Swanson, Attorney representing the Oak Creek Water Management District, discussed with the Commission members the Lake Metigoshe situation, and requested that the Commission place on their agenda for a future meeting, the

consideration of assisting the Water Management District in developing a plan for the cleanout of the lake.

After discussion, it was the consensus of the Commission members that research could begin immediately on this situation and that the staff should be directed to assist wherever possible to get the preliminary plans underway.

> It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission staff be directed to proceed with the preliminary planning for the cleanout of Lake Metigoshe.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION FOR 1981 SESSION

Mike Dwyer, legal counsel for the Water Commission, presented and discussed the following bill drafts and resolutions for possible introduction into the 1981 Legislative Session:

PROPOSED LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO PHASED-TYPE DEVELOPMENT FOR IRRIGATION PERMITS

Mike Dwyer discussed three alternatives relating to phased-type development for water permit applications for irrigation. Mr. Dwyer indicated that these alternatives

had been reviewed by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Irrigation Association, and after a great deal of discussion, it was the Board's recommendation that the following proposal would be the most workable and would provide the most flexibility for irrigators and for potential irrigators:

"An applicant may not apply for a permit or permits for irrigation which, if approved, would enable the applicant, at any one time, to hold a conditional permit or permits for more than four hundred eighty acre-feet of water which has not been applied to beneficial use. Applications submitted in violation of this section shall not be assigned a priority date and shall be returned to the applicant by the State Engineer. This section shall not apply to applications for water permits submitted by irrigation districts organized pursuant to title 61."

This recommendation supporting the above-quoted proposal was presented to the Association at its annual meeting held on December 2, 1980 and the members of the Association adopted a resolution supporting the proposal. The resolution adopted by the North Dakota Irrigation Association is attached hereto as APPENDIX "B".

Mr. Loren DeWitz, President of the North Dakota Irrigation Association, shared with the Commission members the Association's views towards phased development for irrigation and their support for the previously-quoted proposal. Mr. DeWitz indicated that the irrigators felt that the proposal they supported was not to limit irrigation, but to provide for orderly and equitable irrigation development.

> It was moved by Commissioner Just, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission supports the proposed legislation endorsed by the North Dakota Irrigation Association.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO CREATION OF A STATE WATER BANK

Mr. Dwyer discussed a proposal which would provide for the creation of a state water bank program. Copies of this proposed legislation are available at the State Water Commission office.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission supports the proposed legislation for the creation and appropriation of a state water bank program.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION RELATIVE FOR THE PROTECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF RIVERS IN NORTH DAKOTA

Mr. Dwyer presented and discussed proposed legislation relative to the protection and maintenance of rivers in North Dakota. He noted that there is some confusion as to whether or not this is actually a proposal,

but that a bill draft has been prepared. He said that he did not know if this proposal would be introduced into the session. No action was taken by the Commission members.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO APPEALS FROM DECISIONS OF THE STATE WATER COMMISSION AND THE STATE ENGINEER Mr. Dwyer presented and discussed a proposed agency bill relative to appeals from decisions of the State Water Commission, and creating a new section of the North Dakota Century Code relating to appeals from decisions this proposed legislation are available at

of the State Engineer. Copies of this proposed legislation are available at the State Water Commission office.

It was moved by Commissioner Gallagher, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission supports legislation relating to appeals from decisions of the State Water Commission and the State Engineer.

PROPOSED CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DIRECTING LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO STUDY POWERS AND AUTHORITIES OF IRRIGATION DISTRICTS

Mr. Dwyer presented and discussed a proposed concurrent resolution which would direct the Legislative Council to study and review the powers and authorities of irrigation districts,

and related statutes pertaining to irrigation as contained in Chapters 61-05 through 61-14 of the North Dakota Century Code. Mr. Dwyer indicated that the North Dakota Irrigation Association will be introducing this resolution. Copies of this proposed concurrent resolution are available at the State Water Commission office.

PROPOSED CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO STUDY AND REVIEW THE POWERS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STATE WATER COMMISSION

Mr. Dwyer presented and discussed a proposed concurrent resolution which would direct the Legislative Council to study and review the powers, duties and responsibilities of the State Water Commission.

It was moved by Commissioner Just and seconded by Commissioner Lanz that the State Water Commission supports a concurrent resolution which would direct the Legislative Council to study and review the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the State Water Commission.

In discussion of the motion, Mr. Dwyer stated that there have been no changes in the statutes since 1937 when the State Water Commission was created and there are areas that need to be updated.

Commissioner Kramer suggested rather than having the Legislative Council do such a study of the powers and duties of the State Water Commission, another alternative would be to exercise the expertise of the State Engineer and his staff to do an in-depth study of the statutes prior to the next Legislative Session. In areas where deficiencies exist, these could be discussed with the Commission members, and an appropriate recommendation could then be made for legislative action. Commissioner Kramer also stated that in the performance audit done of the Commission, it was noted that the staff is capable of performing such work.

> At this time, Commissioner Just withdrew his original motion; Commissioner Lanz likewise withdrew his second to the original motion.

it was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Gallagher, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission direct the State Engineer and staff to do an in-depth study to review the powers, authorities and duties of the State Water Commission prior to the 1983 Legislative Session.

Mr. Dwyer noted that there will be two agency housekeeping bills introduced into the Legislature relative to water permits.

> It was moved by Commissioner Just, seconded by Commissioner Kramer, and unanimously carried, that the meeting adjourn at 6:00 p.m.

RESOLUTION

OF THE

NORTH DAKOTA IRRIGATION ASSOCIATION

1980

We support legislation which would provide for the phased-development of irrigation water permits by limiting the amount of undeveloped conditional water permits any permittee can hold at one time. Specifically, we propose the following provision be added to Chapter 61-04 of the North Dakota Century Code to implement the phased-development of irrigation water permits:

TIME LIMITATIONS CONCERNING APPLICATIONS.

An applicant may not apply for a permit or permits for irrigation which, if approved, would enable the applicant, at any one time, to hold a conditional permit or permits for more than four hundred eighty acre-feet of water which has not been applied to beneficial use. Applications submitted in violation of this section shall not be assigned a priority date and shall be returned to the applicant by the state engineer. This section shall not apply to applications for water permits submitted by irrigation districts organized pursuant to title 61.

> Adopted by the North Dakota Irrigation Association on December 2, 1980
